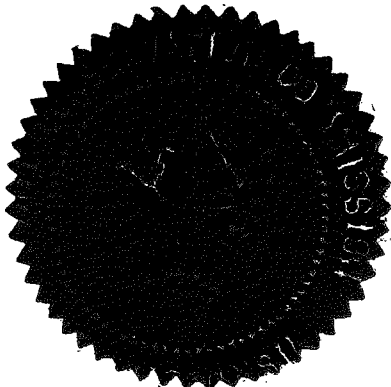

to open seasons and bag limits for trapping :
beaver and otter. :

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,
AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals and recreates rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (c), (d) and (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 10.01 (4)

(c) Beaver

All that part of Wisconsin lying
northerly of state highway 64.....Feb. 1 through 35 per season
April 20

All that part of Wisconsin
lying south and west of a
line beginning at the junction
of U. S. highway 16 with the
west boundary of said state,
thence easterly along said
highway 16 to its junction
with state highway 33, thence
easterly along said highway 33
to its junction with state
highway 73, thence southerly
along said highway 73 to its
junction with U. S. highway
51, thence southerly along
said highway 51 to its junction
with the southern boundary of
said state.....Feb. 25 through 35 per season
Apr. 10

In the counties of Brown,
Calumet, that part of Columbia
lying south and east of state
highway 73, that part of Dane
County lying east of a line
beginning at the junction of

state highway 73 with the north boundary of said county and southerly along said highway 73 to its junction with U. S. highway 51, thence southerly along said highway 51 to its junction with the south boundary of said county, all of Dodge County, except that part lying west of state highway 73, Jefferson, Kenosha, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, that part of Rock County lying east of U. S. highway 51, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha..... None

All other parts of the state of Wisconsin..... Feb. 25 through March 26 35 per season

The skins of all beaver taken in the aforesaid open season beginning on February 1 and extending through February 24 and beginning on March 27 and extending through April 20 shall be tagged pursuant to section 29.132, Wis. Stats., in the county where trapped.

(d) Otter

All that part of Wisconsin lying northerly of state highway 64..... Feb. 1 through Apr. 10 2 per season

In the counties of Brown, Calumet, that part of Columbia lying south and east of state highway 73, that part of Dane County lying east of a line beginning at the junction of state highway 73 with the north boundary of said county and southerly along said highway 73 to its junction with U. S. highway 51, thence southerly along said highway 51 to its junction with the south boundary of said county, all of Dodge County, except that part lying west of state highway 73, Jefferson, Kenosha, Kewaunee,

Manitowoc, Milwaukee, Ozaukee,
Racine, that part of Rock
County lying east of U. S.
highway 51, Walworth,
Washington, and Waukesha..... None

All other parts of the
state of Wisconsin..... Feb. 25 through 2 per season
March 26

(f) Tagging of Otter Pelts

Each person who has trapped an otter during the established open season shall exhibit each pelt to a conservation warden or authorized representative of the Conservation Commission, not later than five days after the close of the otter trapping season. The conservation warden or authorized representative of the Conservation Commission shall inspect the pelt and attach and lock a special tag indicating it has been inspected. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess a raw otter pelt beginning 6 days after the close of the season to the opening date of the following season without such tag attached and locked. Otter taken from February 1 through February 24 and from March 27 through April 10 shall be exhibited and tagged in the county where trapped.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1959.
