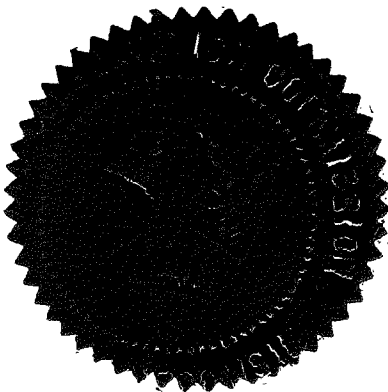

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,
AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.623, 29.174 and 23.09, Wis. Stats., the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby adopts rules as follows:

Section 1. Section WCD 20.15 (1) (h) and (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 20.15 (1) (h) Landing Lake and Mill Lake in Vilas County.

Section 2. Section WCD 20.15 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 20.15 (2) The State Conservation Commission finds, pursuant to Section 29.623, Wis. Stats., that perch are detrimental fish in the following specified waters and that the Commission may remove perch from the waters specified or cause them to be removed therefrom pursuant to ss. 29.62 and 29.625, Wis. Stats.

(a) Landing Lake, Mill Lake, North Twin Lake and South Twin Lake in Vilas County.

Section 3. Section WCD 26.06 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 26.06 Fish Refuges. The following described areas are hereby created and established as fish refuges, and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to take, catch, capture, kill, or fish for fish in any manner from April 1 to May 14 each year, both dates inclusive, in, on or along the following described water areas.

(26) Iron County. (a) That part of the Turtle river beginning at the road bridge on county highway FF in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, township 42 north, range 3 east and thence downstream for a distance of 600 feet.

(68) Waupaca County. (a) Little Wolf river. Beginning at the dam in and across the Little Wolf river, located in section 15, township 23 north, range 13 east, in the village of Manawa, and thence downstream from the said dam for 500 feet.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on April 1, 1959.
