

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (e) and (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are repealed and recreated to read:

#### WCD 10.01 (4) (e) Tagging of otter and beaver pelts

Each person who has trapped an otter or beaver during the established open season for such animals shall exhibit each pelt to an authorized representative of the Conservation Commission in the county in which such animal was trapped, or in the adjoining county, but within the area included within the open season in which such animal was trapped, not later than five days after the close of said season. Said representative shall inspect the pelt and attach and lock a special tag indicating it has been inspected. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess raw pelts from such animals beginning six days after the close of the season to the opening date of the following season without such tag attached and locked. No person shall transfer, give, trade, sell, or purchase, any such pelts without such tag being attached and locked to the head of each pelt.

Section WCD 10.02 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.02 Wild animals protected at all times. (1) There shall be no open season on Canada lynx, timber wolf, badger, woodchuck, moose, elk, marten, fisher, wolverine, flying squirrel or white deer.

WCD 10.06 <u>Hunting hours</u>. (1) All hunting hours when specified in this chapter mean central standard time.

- (2) The hunting hours for each species of game on which an open season is established (except raccoon and all wild animals for which there is no closed season established for which there are no hunting hour restrictions) shall be from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset as listed in the following table and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any such game on any day during the open season before the time listed in the AM column or after the time listed in the PM column.
  - (3) The hunting hours listed in the following table shall apply to the entire state.

#### WCD 10.09 Guns and ammunition

(4) During the period of three days prior to the opening date for hunting deer with firearms, no person shall have in possession any firearm in the area north of State Highway
