

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING, AMENDING
AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

Section WCD 10.06 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.06 Hunting hours. (2) The hunting hours for each species of game, except migratory waterfowl and shorebirds, on which an open season is established (except raccoon and all wild animals for which there is no closed season established for which there are no hunting hour restrictions) shall be from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset as listed in the following table and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any such game on any day during the open season before the time listed in the AM column or after the time listed in the PM column.

Section WCD 10.06 (2m) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 10.06 (2m) The hunting hours for migratory waterfowl and shorebirds shall be from sunrise to sunset except as provided in WCD 10.01 (1) (b) and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot such waterfowl or shorebirds on any day during the open season before 30 minutes after the time listed in the AM column and after the time listed in the PM column in the following table.

Section WCD 10.15 (3) (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.15 (3) (a) An open season is established for hunting cock pheasants, cottontails, jackrabbits, gray and fox squirrels, raccoon, red and gray fox, and opossum, with shotguns or bow and arrow, within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge (except posted closed areas), subject to the provisions of this section, beginning December 16 and continuing until the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife determines that the harvest of pheasants is such that to kill additional pheasants would be detrimental to and would endanger the breeding stock and future supply of pheasants; but not after December 20. Daily bag limits and other general hunting regulations for all game will apply as stated elsewhere in this chapter.

Section WCD 10.16 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.16 (3) An open season for hunting deer with firearms shall be established on the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge and such season shall fall within the season established for the remainder of Juneau county in s. WCD 10.01 (3) (e). Such open season shall be effective only on those areas on the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge designated by posted notice of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. No special permits shall be required but hunting license and deer tag as required by statute are necessary and other regulations as outlined for the remainder of Juneau county under s. WCD 10.01 (3) (e) shall apply.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on October 1, 1959.
