ORDER OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AMENDING AND ADOPTING RULES

Agriculture by sections 93.09, 100.14 and 100.20, Wis. Stats., the State Department of Agriculture hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Section Ag 26.01 (9) (h) of the Wisconsin administrative code is adopted to read:

Ag 26.01 (9) (h) Sunburn, when more than one-third of the surface of the potato shows green color.

SECTION 2. Section Ag 26.02 of the Wisconsin administrative code is renumbered Ag 26.02 (1).

SECTION 3. Section Ag 26.02 (2) of the Wisconsin administrative code is adopted to read:

Ag 26.02 (2) This section shall not apply to potatoes which have been officially inspected and certified as to quality in another state by an authorized agency of such state.

SECTION 4. Section Ag 26.03 (2) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 26.03 (2) No potatoes shall be represented or sold as seed potatoes of a grade prescribed in this chapter unless they have been officially inspected and a certificate issued showing that they conform to such grade.

SECTION 5. Sections Ag 26.05 (4) and (5) of the Wisconsin administrative code are emended to read:

Ag 26.05 (4) Tolerance for defects. In order to allow for variations incident to proper grading and handling other than size, hollow heart, mahogeny browning and internal necrosis, not more than a total of 6% of the potatoes in any lot may fail to meet the required grade, but not more than 3% of the potatoes in any lot shall be affected by late blight or damaged by scab, and including not more than one per cent for potatoes that are frozen or affected with soft rot or wet breakdown. In addition to the above tolerances, not more than 5% of the potatoes may be seriously damaged by sunburn and not more than 5% of the potatoes may be seriously damaged by hollow heart, mahogany browning and internal necrosis. No tolerance shall be allowed for bacterial ring rot.

(5) <u>Bags</u>. Potatoes of this grade shall be in new clean bags bearing the official registered brand or trade-mark for Badger State Brand Certified Seed or the brand of the grower or an organization through which he markets his seed potatoes. They shall not have a grade designation. An official blue tag, printed with the words "Badger State Brand Certified Seed" and showing net weight, variety, season, and name and address of grower, shall be attached to each bag with the official metal seel furnished by

the department.

Note: This subsection to emended to prohibit the use of plain base and bags bearing miscellaneous brands or trade-marks. Its effective date is delayed to August 1, 1961 to avoid hard-ship for growers who had already purchased bags for their 1960 erop.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1961, except the emendment of section Ag 26.05 (5), which shall take effect August 1, 1961.
