Section WCD 10.09 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.09 (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to carry or have in his possession or under control while hunting or pursuing any game birds, game animals or other wild animals any shotshells loaded with single slug or ball except during the open firearm season for deer or bear or any shell, cartridge or ammunition known as tracer shells, burning tracer shells or any incendiary shells or cartridges which may be discharged from any shotgun, rifle or other firearms, except hunter distress flares.

Section WCD 10.12 (1) (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 10.12 (f) It shall be unlawful to hunt waterfowl except from a blind during the open season for geese within the area described in 10.01 (1)(a), and not more than three persons shall occupy any blind at one time, nor shall any person hunt waterfowl from a blind placed within 200 yards of any other blind occupied by one or more waterfowl hunters or within 100 yards of the boundary of the property on which such blind is located.
