

**ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,  
AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES**

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.05, 29.174, 29.107 and 29.02, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

The open season for hunting grouse in the area described in WCB 10.01 (1)(a), shall close when the conservation director determines that the harvest of Canada grouse in Dodge and Ford de Lac Counties has reached a total of 8,500. The open season for hunting grouse in the remainder of Dodge and Ford de Lac Counties shall close when the conservation director determines that the harvest of Canada grouse in said counties has reached a total of 10,000.

2. The open season for hunting grouse in the area described in WCB 10.01 (1)(b) in the counties of Jensen, Monroe, and Wood shall close when the conservation director determines that the harvest of Canada grouse has reached 2,000 in said area.

3. The open season for hunting grouse in the areas described in WCB 10.01 (1)(a) and (b) shall close when the conservation director determines that the harvest of Canada grouse in said areas has reached a combined total of 12,500, and that to kill additional Canada grouse in said areas would be detrimental to and would endanger the breeding stock and future supply of Canada grouse.

there are no hunting hour restrictions) shall be from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset as listed in the following table and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot such game on any day during the open season before the time listed in the AM column or after the time listed in the PM column.

Section WIS 10.06 (2)(m) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WIS 10.06 (2m) The hunting hours for migratory waterfowl and shorebirds shall be from sunrise to sunset except as otherwise provided in s. WIS 10.03 (1) and 10.15 (4) and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot such waterfowl and shorebirds on any day during the open season before 30 minutes after the time listed in the AM column or after the time listed in the PM column of the following table:

Section WIS 10.07 (8) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WIS 10.07 (8) It shall be <sup>for any person</sup> unlawful to fail to make every reasonable effort to retrieve all game birds killed or crippled by him; and until such effort is made, such game birds shall be included in his daily bag.

Section WIS 10.15 (4)(a) and (c) 3a and 4b of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WIS 10.15 (4)(a) The open season for hunting geese on the Huron National Wildlife Refuge shall begin on October 7 at 12:00 noon. Daily shooting hours shall be from sunrise to 2:00 p.m. The daily bag limit shall be one goose of any species.

(c) 3 a. Reservation requests by mail only on official application forms will be accepted at the Wisconsin Conservation Department, Madison. Such requests must be postmarked no later than September 15. Applications which are postmarked after that date will be rejected.

4 b. Leave the immediate vicinity of the managed hunting unit without first surrendering the permit in person at the checking station where it was obtained. The immediate vicinity of the managed hunting unit is defined as the special area in which the 2 p.m. daily closing hour is in effect as described in WIS 10.03 (1)(a).
