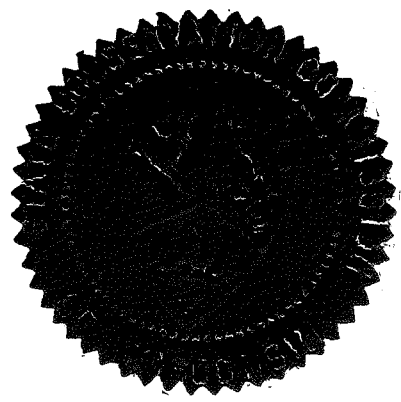

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,  
AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin  
by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State  
Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as  
follows:

WCD 10.01 Open and Closed Seasons: A closed season is established for each species of wild animal and bird named herein extending during all the time of each year except the open season period embraced within the specified dates, both inclusive. Such open season shall apply to all of the area described in each locality except as otherwise provided in Chapters WCD 11 and WCD 15 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code. Except as otherwise expressly provided, no person shall take, catch, kill, hunt, pursue, shoot, or trap any wild animal or bird at any time other than the open season and the established hunting hours therefor, nor in the open season in excess of the daily bag limit designated for each species or each locality, respectively, nor have any such protected wild animal or bird in his possession or under his control in excess of the possession limit.

Firearm season  
 There shall be an open season for hunting deer with rifles, shotguns loaded with single slug or ball, and with bow and arrow in described zones during the period designated "Firearm season".

Shotgun season  
 There shall be an open season for hunting deer with smooth-bore muzzle loading muskets of not less than .45 caliber, rifled muzzle loading muskets of not less than .40 caliber, and shotguns loaded with single slug or ball, and with bow and arrow in described zones during the period designated "shotgun season".

Zone A:  
 On all islands except Madeline Island in the outlying waters of Lake Superior in the counties of Ashland and Bayfield, commonly known as the Apostle Islands.

Firearm season..... Oct. 15 through Nov. 25      One deer per season, either sex

Zone B:  
 The counties of Pierce, Pepin (except Nine Mile Island), Buffalo, Trempealeau, La Crosse, and that part of Vernon west of State Hwy. 131.

a. In the counties of Pierce, Pepin (except Nine Mile Island), and Buffalo:

Shotgun season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 18      One deer per season, either sex

Nov. 19 through Nov. 23      One buck deer with antlers not less than 3 inches in length.

Shotgun season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 18 One deer per season, either sex

Pierce season..... Nov. 19 through Nov. 23 One buck deer per season with antler not less than 3 inches in length.

**Zone C:**

All parts of the state lying southerly of a line beginning at the junction of State Hwy. 60 extended westerly along Cherokee County Highway 9 to Lake Michigan which is the east boundary of the state, thence westerly along Wisconsin Hwy. thence southwesterly along the main channel of said river to its junction with the east boundary of Crawford County, thence north and west along the east and north boundaries, respectively, of said county to its junction with the Mississippi River which is the west boundary of the state.

a. In the counties of Crawford, Grant, and Iowa: One deer per season, either sex

Pierce season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 18 One deer per season, either sex

b. In all other parts of Zone C: except Milwaukee County One deer per season, either sex

Shotgun season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 18 One deer per season, either sex

c. Milwaukee County No open season

**Zone D:**

All other parts of the state including Madeline Island, Ashland County not specifically included in Zones A, B, and C.

a. In the counties or parts of counties of Dodge, Washington, Ozaukee, Sheboygan, Fond du Lac, Winnebago, Calumet, Manitowish, Kenosha, Brown, Outagamie, Winneconne, part of Shawano lying south of State Hwy. 29, St. Croix, and Dunn (except Nine Mile Island) One buck deer per season with antler not less than 3 inches in length.

Shotgun season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 25



D. In all other parts of Zone D:

Firearm season..... Nov. 17 through Nov. 25 One buck deer per season with antlers not less than 3 inches in length.

2. Bow and arrow season

There shall be an open season for hunting deer with bow and arrow only in all counties of the state.

(g) Bear

Trapping on the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge shall be conducted under written permit from the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. Such permit shall be subject to all the rules and regulations governing trapping set forth in this chapter.

2) An open season for hunting deer, and unprotected wild animals as listed in Section WCD 10.04, with bow and arrow shall be established on the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge and said season shall be concurrent with the state-wide season for
