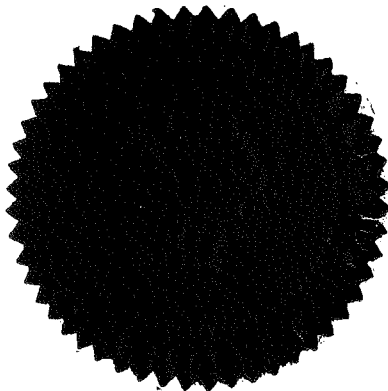

Pursuant to authority vesting in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

WCD 10.06 (1) All hunting hours, when specified in this chapter, mean Central Standard Time, and the sunrise (a.m.) and sunset (p.m.) hours listed in the table under paragraph (4) shall apply to the entire state.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any species of game except deer and bear, on which an open season is established, on any day during the open season before the time listed in the a.m. column, or after the time listed in the p.m. column in the table in paragraph (4), except as provided in Section WCD 10.01 (1) and WCD 10.15 (4) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code. There are no hunting hour restrictions for raccoon and all wild animals for which no closed season is established.

(3) It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any deer and bear during the open season with firearms on any day during the open season before thirty minutes before the time listed in the a.m. column, and after the time listed in the p.m. column in the table in paragraph (4).

Section WCD 10.11 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.11 (3) No person shall use or have in his possession or under his control while hunting any wild animal or bird any poisoned or drugged arrow, arrow with explosive tips, or any bow drawn, held or released by mechanical means. Arrows used for hunting deer or bear shall have well-sharpened metal broad-head blades not less than seven-eighths of an inch in width, and not more than one and one-half inches in width.

Section WCD 10.11 (5) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 10.11 (5) No person may possess a bow while in, on, or traversing areas inhabited by deer during the open season for hunting deer from one-half hour after the close of hunting hours established in WCD 10.06 (3) to one-half hour before sunrise unless such bow is unstrung or enclosed within a carrying case.

Section WCD 10.115 (1), (5), and (6) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.115 (1) The commission finds, pursuant to section 29.107, Wis. Stats., that the population of deer is such that an additional harvest is reasonably necessary to manage the deer herd properly in the state in balance with the available range and natural food supply, and there shall be open seasons for deer hunting by deer hunting parties of not less than four persons, pursuant to section 29.107, Wis. Stats., as established by Wisconsin Administrative Code subsection WCD 10.01 (3) (e) 1 and designated as quota areas.

(5) The conservation director shall distribute for issuance 50% of the total available permits to the county clerk of each county within the quota area described under Wisconsin Administrative Code subsection WCD 10.01 (3) (e) 1. The number allocated to each county clerk for issuance shall be determined by the conservation director and will be in the ratio of the land area of each county in the quota area to the total land area of the quota area. Such permits shall be issued on a first-come, first-served basis from the office of such county clerk beginning at 1:00 p.m. on September 29. The county clerk shall return all permits when requested to do so not issued by him to the conservation director for issuance.

(6) Permits shall be issued by the conservation commission to persons duly applying by mailed application which must be postmarked no later than October 11. Validation of such mailed applications will be made by random selection from all eligible applications received for each quota area.

Section WCD 10.115 (7) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 10.115 (7) All permits remaining unissued for any designated quota area after all applications filed pursuant to paragraphs (5) and (6) have been processed may be issued by the conservation director on a first-come, first-served basis to deer hunting parties duly applying therefor.

Section WCD 10.12 (5) (c) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section WCD 10.15 (2) is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 10.15 Horicon National Wildlife Refuge
(2) Horicon Managed Gun Deer Hunt

- (a) Deer of any age and either sex and fox may be taken with smooth-bore muzzle-loading muskets of not less than .45 caliber, rifled muzzle-loading muskets of not less than .40 caliber and shotgun loaded with single slug or ball within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge (except posted closed areas), subject to provisions of this section, on November 20, 21, and 22.
- (b) Hunting on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge is permitted under permit (arm band) only, as authorized by the Bureau of Sports Fisheries and Wildlife. The number of permits issued shall not exceed 300 per day and a permit shall be valid for one day only. Permits not used for reservations or made available when hunters check out will not be re-issued. In order to assure better hunter distribution, entry to the refuge shall be at designated access points only. Daily hunting hours shall be from 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- (c) Reservations for a permit must be applied for in person and will be issued at the Horicon Marsh Wildlife Area Headquarters commencing on November 6 and ending November 19, on a first-come, first-served basis. Reservations will be issued between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. each day except Sundays until the 900 reservations have been allotted. Only one reservation per person may be obtained and hunting licenses shall be marked to show a reservation.
- (d) Reservations and permits are not transferable and the person whose name appears on the reservation must present the reservation in person at the designated check station on the date shown and must submit his hunting license, and corresponding deer and back tags for inspection. Check stations will start issuing permits at 4:00 a.m. each day of the season.
- (e) A service fee of \$1.00 per person per trip shall be paid by each person.
- (f) When finished hunting, each hunter must surrender in person his numbered arm band at the checking station through which he entered, and then submit for examination such game as he may have bagged, not later than 6:00 P.m. of issue date.

Section WCD 10.20 (1) (c) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section WCD 10.20 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.20 (2) Recording of deer and bear taken during the bow and arrow only season. Each person who has killed a deer or bear during the open season for hunting such animals with bow and arrow only shall exhibit and register such deer or bear as provided in subsection 1, except that the carcass of such deer or bear shall be exhibited within the county or adjoining county where killed by 5:00 p.m. of the day after the taking or killing thereof.

Section WCD 10.22 (2) (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.22 (2) (a) Permits for hunting deer, waterfowl and squirrels only shall be issued in 1965. Waterfowl hunting will be permitted only from the opening

day of the general duck season to the Sunday preceding the start of the deer-gun season with bag limits the same as those that apply in the remainder of Wood county except that no hunter will be permitted to harvest more than six Canada geese from the Sandhill area during the entire season. Bow-deer and squirrel hunting will be permitted only during the same period open for water-fowl hunting. Gun-deer hunting shall open on the same date that applies to the remainder of Wood county and continue until at least 200 deer have been registered at the checking station. Season bag limit either by bow or gun shall be one deer of either sex. The daily squirrel bag limits shall be the same as that for the remainder of Wood county.

Section WCD 10.23 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.23 Recording of geese.

(1) Each person who has killed a goose during the open season within the area described in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsection WCD 10.01 (1) (a) and (b) shall register such goose at an authorized registration station not later than 7 p.m. of the day of taking or killing thereof. Such goose shall be wholly intact except that it may be field dressed. A special tag shall be attached and remain on the carcass until consumed. Such goose shall not be removed from the area described in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsection WCD 10.01 (1) (a) and (b) unless it has been so tagged.

Section WCD 11.06 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section WCD 11.08 (3) (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 11.08 (3) (a) Thornton.
