

# ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (c) and (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 10.01 (4)

Kind of Animal and Locality

Open Season (both dates inclusive)

Bag Limit

(c) Beaver

ZONE A

- (1) All that part of the state lying northerly of a line beginning at the junction of State Highway 64 and the west boundary of the state, thence easterly along said Highway 64 to its junction with State Highway 32, thence northerly along said Highway 32 to its junction with U. S. Highway 8, thence easterly along said Highway 8 to its junction with the Menominee River which is the boundary of the state.
- (2) All that part of the state lying easterly and southerly of a line beginning at the junction of U. S. Highway 61 with the southern boundary of the state, thence northerly along said Highway 61 to its junction with State Highway 82, thence easterly along said Righway & to its junction with State Highway 33, thence easterly along said Highway 33 to its junction with State Highway 23, thence northeasterly along said Highway 23 to its junction with State Highway 73, thence southerly along said Highway 73 to its junction with State Highway 60, thence easterly along said Highway 60 to its junction with Ozaukee County Highway "Q", thence extended easterly to its junction with Lake Michigan which is the Eastern boundary of the state.
- (3) In the following described trout vaters:

#### Shawano County

Comet Creek - Beginning at the center line of the Town Road bridge at the south line of Section 17, T26N, R11E, Town of Kind of Animal and Locality

Open Season (both dates inclusive)

Reg Limit

Germania, upstream to its headwaters and all waters tributary thereto.

### Merethon County

Plover River - Beginning at the center line of the State Highway 153 bridge, Section 34, T27N, R9E, Town of Reid, upstream to its headwaters and all waters tributary thereto.

Little Wolf River - Beginning at the center line of the first bridge north of the Marathon-Portage County line on State Highway 49, Section 35, T26N, RIOE, Town of Franzen, upstream to its headwaters and all waters tributary thereto.

Comet Creek - Continuation of Shavano County description (see Shavano County).

- Spring Brook Beginning at the junction with the South Branch of the Embarrass River at Eland, Section 31, T28M, R1LE, Town of Birnamwood, Shawano County, upstream to its headwaters and all waters tributary thereto.
- (4) That part of Waupaca County lying north of State Highway 161 and west of State Highway 110, and that part of Portage County lying north of State Highway 161, County Highway "SS" and State Highway 10, and east of County Highway "J".
  - (5) Menominee County

Peb. 5 through April 30 35 per season

### ZONE B

In the counties of Brown, Calumet, Dodge (except those parts lying northerly of State Highways 68 and 33, westerly of State Highway 73, and southerly of State Highway 60), Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Outagamie, that part of Ozaukee north of State Highway 60 and County Highway "Q" extended The total combined season bag and possession limit for all parts of Zone A is 35 beaver, and it is unlawful to trap in any zone more than the season bag limit established for such Zone.

(d) Otter. The opening date for the trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping beaver in all zones established under par. (c) of this section. The open season for trapping otter shall extend through March 15 in Zone A and through March 6 in Zone C. There shall be no open season in Zone B. The season bag limit is 2 otter. Each person who has trapped an otter will affix to such carcass immediately upon trapping a tag issued by the Wisconsin Conservation Department. Upon request such tags will be issued free of charge by the Wisconsin Conservation Department, Box 450, Madison, Wisconsin 53701.

Section WCD 20.03 (1) (t) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed. Confirmed by the Wisconsin Conservation Commission on January 14, 1966.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1966.
