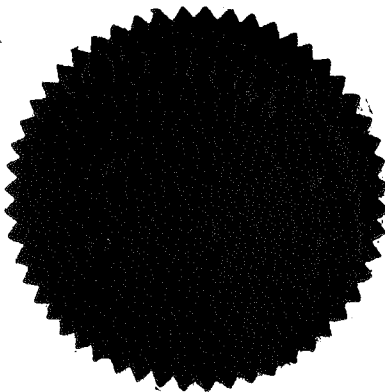

IN THE MATTER of repealing and re-creating Section WCD 10.01 (1) (a), (b), (c) and (d); amending Sections WCD 10.06 (3) and WCD 10.15 (4) (a) and creating Section WCD 11.06 (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code with specific reference to the open season for waterfowl; bow hunting hours, and a closed area for waterfowl in Kewaunee County

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN  
ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Conservation Director of the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.174 (4a), 23.09, and 227.027, Wis. Stats., and in accordance with Section WCD 10.01 (1) (e) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby amends rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (1) (a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

Section WCD 10.06 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.06 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any deer and bear on any day during the open season before 30 minutes before the time listed in the a.m. column and after the time listed in the p.m. column in paragraph (4).

Section WCD 10.15 (4) (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.15 (4) (a) The open season for hunting geese on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge shall begin on September 25 at 12 noon. Daily shooting hours shall be as described in WCD 10.01 (1) (a). The daily bag limit shall be one goose of any species.

Section WCD 11.06 (9) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 11.06 (9) Keweenaw County (a) Ahnapee

Township 25 north, range 25 east, town of Ahnapee

Section 15 -- All that part of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  lying west of state highway 42, except the south 100 feet lying east of Ahnapee River and west of state highway 42.

Section 16 -- All that part lying east of county highway M and west of state highway 42, except the N $\frac{1}{2}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and except the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and the E $\frac{1}{2}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  lying east of the Ahnapee River.

Section 21 -- All that part of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  lying northeasterly of county highway M.

Section 22 -- All that part lying east of county highway M and west of state highway 42, except that part located within the Algoma city limits and Lot 1, Block A of assessor's plat, and except that part of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  lying east of Ahnapee River.

The amendment contained herein shall take effect the day following publication in the official state paper as provided in Section 227.027, Wis. Stats., as an emergency rule. Facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

The framework for waterfowl regulations permitted Wisconsin by the U. S. Department of the Interior was not received in sufficient time to allow normal processing and publication in the register.

Also included is a correction of an omission in the present Administrative Code to establish bow and arrow hunting hours.

A waterfowl closed area is also established in Keweenaw County.

The preservation of the public safety and welfare necessitates the adoption of such rules as emergency rules.
