ORDER OF THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Board of Health by Sections 140.05 (3) and 146.19 (2), Wisconsin Statutes, the State Board of Health hereby repeals and recreates rules as follows:

Subsection H 76.05 (2) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is repealed and recreated to read:

H 76.05 (2) Every habitable room excepting house trailers furnished by a person other than the occupant shall not be less than seven feet in height from the floor to the ceiling. House trailers furnished by other than the occupant shall not be less than 6 feet, 3 inches in height from the floor to the ceiling. In the calculation of the minimum cubic feet of volume per occupant in sleeping rooms, the space below ceilings lower than 5 feet or the space above ceilings higher than 9.5 feet shall not be included.

Section H 76.11 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is repealed and recreated to read:

H 76.11 Management. It is the duty of the camp owner or operator, together with any attendants or persons in charge of such camp to:

(1) See that the grounds and all common-use spaces of service buildings and other structures including toilets and privies are policed at least daily and maintained in a clean, orderly condition and that all elements of a building or structure shall be properly repaired. In camps occupied by 100 or more persons, a full-time person shall be provided to perform these duties.


(2) See that each migrant laborer to whom a dwelling unit has been assigned takes responsibility for the cleanliness of that unit and adjacent grounds.

(3) Report to the health officer all cases of persons or animals affected or suspected of being affected with any communicable disease.

(4) Designate some individual or employe to be responsible for the compliance with these standards and such person's name is to appear on the regulations posted in accordance with section H 76.13.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on December 1, 1966 as provided in Section 227.026 (1), Wisconsin Statutes, subject to approval under the provisions of Section 14.225, Wisconsin Statutes.
