
TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

ORDER OF THE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION


Pursuant to authority vested in the Industrial Commission by section 101.01 to 101.29 Wis. Stats., the Industrial Commission hereby repeals, recreates, and adopts rules as follows:

Ind 73.01 Hours of Work. (1) Canning and freezing establishments must arrange their work so that during the season of actual canning or first processing of the product, women 18 years of age or over and boys and girls 16 and 17 years of age shall not be required nor permitted to work more than 9 hours in any day nor more than 54 hours in any week, except in emergencies as provided in section Ind 73.02. For the purpose of this chapter, a day is the 24 hours beginning at 6:00 a.m. of each calendar day; a week means a calendar week, or a regular recurring period of 168 hours in the form of 7 consecutive 24-hour periods.

Ind 73.06 Wage Rates. (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this section, a woman 18 years of age or over or a boy or girl 16 or 17 years of age who works over 9 hours in any day or 54 hours in any week shall be paid for such daily or weekly overtime hours occurring in any week, whichever is the greater, at the rate of one and one-half times the regular rate payable to the employe for the work performed.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code as provided in Section 227.
