

ORDER OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS  
AMENDING AND ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by section 108.14 (2), Wis. Stats., the Department hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Section IND-UC 110.05 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Ind-UC 110.05 (2) VALUE OF ROOM OR MEALS. In determining an employe's wages from any employing unit under chapter 108, Wis. Stats., any lodging or meals furnished as part of the employe's pay shall, unless a different specific showing is made, be valued as follows:

- (a) Lodging - \$11.60 per week or \$1.65 per day; and
- (b) Meals - \$17.40 per week or \$ .85 per meal.


SECTION 2. Section Ind-UC 126.05 (2) (intro. par.) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is adopted to read:

Ind-UC 126.05 (2) Such advance notice may be given a claimant whenever such a search may reasonably be directed under the given circumstances, as evidenced by:
