There shall be an open season for hunting deer with rifle and shotguns loaded with single slug or ball, in described zones during the period designated "firearm season".

Shotgun Season:

There shall be an open season for hunting deer with smoothbore, muzzle-loading muskets of not less than .45 caliber, rifled muzzle-loading muskets of not less than .40 caliber, and shotguns loaded with single slug or ball, in described zones during the period designated "shotgun season".

ZONE "A"

In all portions of the state not otherwise listed in the following described season zones, "B" through "G".

a. In the counties or parts of counties of Brown, Calumet, Dane (west of state highway 78 and north of U.S. highway 18), Fond du Lac, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Outagamie, Sheboygan, Shawano (south of state highway 29), Waupaca and Winnebago.  
Shotgun Season-----

Beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for nine consecutive days.

One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

b. All other parts of Zone "A"  
Firearm Season-----

Same as above.

One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

ZONE "B"

The counties or parts of counties of Buffalo, Chippewa (south of State Highway 64 and west of U.S. Highway 53), Dunn (south of State Highway 64), Eau Claire (west of U.S. Highway 53 and State Highway 93), Jackson (south of State Highways 54, 71, and 108), La Crosse, Monroe (south of State Highway 71 and west of State Highway 27), Pepin, Pierce, St. Croix (south of State Highway 64), Trempealeau (west and south of State Highways 93 and 121, U.S. Highway 53 and State Highway 54), Vernon (north and west of State Highway 82 and State Highway 27).

Beginning on Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for two consecutive days.

Beginning on the day immediately after the season described above and continuing for seven consecutive days.

One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

b. In the counties of Eau Claire (west of U.S. Highway 53 and State Highway 93), Jackson (south of State Highways 54, 108, and 71), La Crosse, Monroe (south of State Highway 71 and west of State Highway 27), and Trempealeau (west and south of State Highways 93 and 121, U.S. Highway 53 and State Highway 54).  
Shotgun Season-----

Beginning on Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for two consecutive days.

One deer per season, either sex.

Firearm Season----- Beginning on the day immediately after the season described above and continuing for seven consecutive days. One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

c. All other parts of Zone "B"

Shotgun Season----- Beginning on Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for two consecutive days. One deer per season, either sex.

Beginning on the day immediately after the season described above and continuing for seven consecutive days. One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

ZONE "C"

The counties of Crawford, Grant, Green, Lafayette and that part of Vernon county south of State Highway 82 and U.S. Highway 61.

Firearm Season----- Beginning on Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for three consecutive days. One deer per season, either sex.

(2) Small game and waterfowl hunting hour zones are established as follows:

Zone

- A--all that part of the state lying east of 88°-00' longitude
- B--all that part of the state lying between 88°-00' and 89°-00' long.
- C--all that part of the state lying between 89°-00' and 90°-00' long.
- D--all that part of the state lying between 90°-00' and 91°-00' long.
- E--all that part of the state lying between 91°-00' and 92°-00' long.
- F--all that part of the state lying west of 92°-00' longitude

The hunting hours for small game and waterfowl in Zone A are listed in the following table. Hunting hours in Zone B are established by adding 4 minutes to the a.m. and p.m. columns for Zone A for each day; for Zone C by adding 8 minutes to the a.m. and p.m. columns for Zone A; for Zone D by adding 12 minutes to the a.m. and p.m. columns for Zone A; for Zone E by adding 16 minutes to the a.m. and p.m. columns for Zone A; and for Zone F by adding 20 minutes to the a.m. and p.m. columns for Zone A.

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any species of game except deer and bear on which an open season is established on any day during the open season before the time established by the a.m. column or after the time established by the p.m. column in any hunting hour zone, except as provided in Wis. Adm. Code section NR 10.25. There are no hunting hour restrictions for fox, raccoon and all wild animals for which no closed season is established.

Section 4. NR 10.07(9)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 10.07(9)

(b) No person shall place any material attractive to bear at any time other than the period beginning on the Saturday nearest August 15 and ending on the last day of the early bow season. No material attractive to bear shall be placed within 50 yards of any trail, road or campsite used by the public.

Section 65. NR 10.09(4) and (5) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:

NR 10.09

(4) During the 24-hour period prior to the opening date for hunting deer with firearms, no person shall have in possession any firearm in any area wherein there is an open season for deer with firearms, unless the firearm is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case, except that waterfowl hunters shall be permitted to hunt waterfowl continually during the open season.

(5) During the period beginning June 1 and ending December 31 it shall be unlawful for any person to carry in any manner or have in possession or under control shot larger than No. BB while hunting.

Section 6. NR 10.201 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

NR 10.201 Recording of Wildcat (Bobcat)

(1) Each person who has killed a wildcat (bobcat) by hunting or trapping during the established open season shall exhibit each animal to an authorized representative of the DNR in the county in which such animal was taken, or in an adjoining county within six days of such taking. Said representatives shall inspect the animal and attach and lock a special tag indicating it has been inspected. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess raw pelts from such animals beginning six days after the close of the season to the opening date of the following seasons without such tag attached and locked. No person shall transfer, give, trade, sell, or purchase any such pelts without such tag being attached and locked to the head of each pelt. This section shall not apply to wildcat taken outside of the State of Wisconsin.

Section 7. NR 10.21(3)(a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 10.21

(3)(a) Except as provided in section 29.579, Wis. Stats., no person shall keep alive in captivity any animal or bird on which there is a closed season at any time, or any fox, skunk, raccoon, or coyote, unless a game or fur farm or wildlife exhibit license has been first obtained from the department of natural resources.



Section 8. NR 10.22 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 10.22 Sandhill Wildlife Demonstration Area, Wood County. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, hunt, trap, or pursue any species of wild animal or bird at any time, or have in possession or under control any firearm unless the same is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case or any bow and arrow unless the same is unstrung or enclosed in a carrying case upon that area known as the Sandhill wildlife demonstration area in Wood county, Wisconsin, except as provided in this section.

(2)(a) Daily hunting permits shall be issued to hunters at established check stations on a first-come, first-served basis on the day for which the permit is to be issued. Such permits shall be issued without charge for the purpose of conducting research on hunting methods and success. It shall be unlawful to hunt on such area without a permit. Permits shall be subject to the following limitations:

(b) Permits for hunting waterfowl, squirrels, and ruffed grouse only shall be issued in 1973. Waterfowl hunting will be permitted only from the opening day of the general duck season through the Sunday immediately prior to the opening day of the deer gun season with bag limits the same as those that apply in the remainder of Wood county. Squirrel and ruffed grouse hunting will be permitted only during the same period open for waterfowl hunting. The daily bag limit on squirrels and ruffed grouse shall be the same as for the remainder of Wood county.

(c) Daily hunting permits shall be limited to allow not more than 75 hunters for squirrels and ruffed grouse at any one time. Daily hunting permits for waterfowl shall be limited to 102 or less depending upon seasonal water conditions.

(d) Permits shall be issued for and the permittee limited to hunting in a single designated hunting compartment.

(e) Permits shall be issued only to persons possessing a valid Wisconsin hunting license.

(f) All permits shall be valid only for the date issued, and such permit or any other identification issued shall be turned in at a checking station upon leaving the area.

(g) All game taken pursuant to this section shall be exhibited to the department of natural resources or its agents at a checking station for examination, identification and marking before leaving the area.

(h) Hunters waiting to apply for permits must form a single line. Each vehicle in the line may contain no more than 5 applicants and must be occupied at all times by all persons desiring to apply for permits that day.

Section 9. NR 11.27(16)(a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 11.27

(16) Shawano County. (a) Navarino.

Section 5--All that part of the SW 1/4 SW1/4 lying west of STH 187.

Section 3--That part of the East one-half (E1/2 of the southeast one-quarter SE1/4) of Section three(3), Township eight (8) north, of range eighteen (18) east, in the Town of Merton, Waukesha county, Wisconsin, bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner thereof in the center line of County Trunk Highway "E"; thence west on and along the north line thereof 1,318.00 feet to the northwest corner of the east one-half (E1/2) of the southeast one-quarter (SE1/4); thence south 0° 14' 59" west on and along the west line thereof 618.93 feet to a point; thence north 26° 37' 18" east on a line 655.28 feet to a point 33.00 feet south (measured at right angles) from the north line of the east one-half (E1/2) of said southeast one-quarter (SE1/4) section; thence east on a line parallel to the north line of said southeast one-quarter (SE1/4) section 1,027.06 feet to the east section line - the center of County Trunk Highway "E"; thence north on said east section line 33.00 feet to the point of beginning.

Section 11. NR 19.01(1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 19.01


(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to carry in any manner or have in possession or under control any rifle other than a .22 rim-fire or any shotgun loaded with shot larger than No. BB, divided or cut shells of any variety, or any shells loaded with single ball or bullet, or have in their possession or under their control any shotgun shells loaded with shot larger than No. BB or any divided or cut shells or shells loaded with single ball or bullet from June 1 of each year through the following December 31, both dates inclusive, while being in or on or traversing any forest, fields, or other areas frequented or inhabited by deer in the counties of Adams, Ashland, Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Chippewa, Clark, Columbia, Door, Douglas, Eau Claire, Florence, Forest, Green Lake, Iron, Jackson, Juneau, Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon, Marinette, Marquette, Monroe, Oconto, Oneida, Outagamie, Polk, Portage, Price, Rusk, Sauk, Sawyer, Shawano, Taylor, Vilas, Washburn, Waupaca, Waushara, and Wood, except that when an open season for deer or bear occurs in any of the before-mentioned counties, any person may carry lawful firearms and ammunition into and onto areas frequented or inhabited by deer or bear during the period of time beginning 5 days prior to the opening of the deer season or bear season, as the case may be, and ending at midnight of the third day following the closing of such season when such firearms are unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case.

The foregoing rules and regulations were approved at the June 28, 1973 meeting of the Natural Resources Board, and will take effect upon publication.


