

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 29.085, 29.415 and 227.02, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals and recreates rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - NR 27 is repealed and recreated to read:

CHAPTER NR 27

Endangered Species

NR 27.01 Scope and applicability. This chapter contains rules necessary to implement the Wisconsin Endangered Species Act of 1971 (section 29.415, Wis. Stats.). The regulations in this chapter govern the taking, transportation, possession, processing or sale within this state of any fish or wildlife specified by the department's list of endangered fish and wildlife.

NR 27.02 Definitions. As used in this chapter:

(1) "Department list of endangered species" shall consist of 2 lists: the federal endangered domestic and foreign species and the Wisconsin endangered species.

(2) "Federal endangered domestic and foreign species list" shall mean the list of species or subspecies of fish and wildlife native to the United States that are threatened with extinction and species or subspecies of fish and wildlife found in other countries that are threatened with worldwide extinction, as published in the code of federal regulations, title 50, revised as of January 1, 1971 and as subsequently amended.

(3) "Fish and wildlife" shall mean any species or subspecies of any mammal, fish, wild bird, amphibian, reptile, mollusk or crustacean, any part, products, eggs or offspring thereof or the dead body or parts thereof.

(4) "Person" shall mean any individual, partnership, association and bodies politic and corporate.

(5) "Take" shall mean shooting, shooting at, pursuing, hunting, catching, or killing any endangered species.

(6) "Wisconsin endangered species list" shall mean the list of species or subspecies native to Wisconsin that are threatened with statewide extirpation, as published in this chapter.

NR 27.04 Revision of Wisconsin endangered species list. (1) The department shall annually review the Wisconsin endangered species list. If the department finds revisions may be necessary, it shall adopt such revisions by its normal rule-making procedure under chapter 227, Wis. Stats.

(2) (a) Any 3 persons may petition the department to review any fish and wildlife on the Wisconsin endangered species list. Such petitions must be dated, and in writing and submitted to the Department of Natural Resources, Bureau of Fish and Wildlife Management, Box 450, Madison, Wisconsin 53701. In order to be considered, requests must show in full the following information:

1. Names and addresses of persons petitioning;
2. Designation of the particular species or subspecies in question;
3. Narrative explanation of the request for review and justification for a change in the status of the species or subspecies in question;
4. Complete scientific supporting data for the request; and
5. Signatures of the persons making the request.

(b) If the department finds the petitioners have presented substantial evidence to warrant a review, the department shall proceed in accordance with chapter 227, Wis. Stats.

NR 27.05 (1) No person may take, transport, possess, process or sell within this state any fish or wildlife on the department list of endangered species without a permit issued by the department.

(2) The department may issue permits for the taking, transportation, possession, processing and selling within the state of any fish and wildlife on the department list of endangered species for zoological, educational or scientific purposes or for the propagation of such fish and wildlife in captivity for preservation, or raw furs and furs when dressed or made into garments. Such permits shall be issued in accordance with procedures

established in section NR 19.11, Wis. Adm. Code. Any person obtaining a permit under this section need not obtain a scientific collector's permit under section NR 19.11, Wis. Adm. Code for that same species and purpose.

(3) An application for such permit must be submitted to the department stating the species, number, source and intended manner and time of use of any endangered fish and wildlife to be utilized by the applicant. Following approval of this application, authorized endangered fish and wildlife obtained by the applicant must upon request be shown to the department or its deputies. Furs shall be marked or stamped with a stamp or tag furnished by the department to show such fish and wildlife are legally held and possessed.

(4) A federal permit is required for all fish and wildlife on the federal lists, unless they waive such requirement.

NR 27.06 Exceptions to permit requirements. (1) Any person taking, transporting, possessing or selling any fish or wildlife included in the federal endangered domestic and foreign species list does not need a state permit if such person has a federal permit.

(2) (a) Any person taking, transporting, possessing, processing or selling the product of any fish or wildlife included in the federal endangered domestic and foreign list or included in the Wisconsin endangered species list does not need a state permit if such products were acquired before December 28, 1973 for federal endangered foreign and domestic species or if such products were acquired before April 1972 for Wisconsin endangered species. For species or subspecies of fish and wildlife added to these lists after the above dates, no permit is required for products of fish and wildlife acquired before the effective date of the addition.

(b) Any person claiming an exemption under the above provision must offer sufficient evidence to show that the product was acquired prior to the effective dates.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on May 22, 1975.

The rules contained herein shall take effect upon publication.
