*ORDER OF THE VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD
ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES*

Pursuant to authority vested in the Veterinary Examining Board by section 15.08(5), Wisconsin Statutes, and section 453.06, Wisconsin Statutes, the Veterinary Examining Board repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section VE 2.03 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

VE 2.03 Educational qualifications. Applicants for license shall submit proof of graduation from an approved school of veterinary medicine. Schools in the United States and Canada, approved by the American Veterinary Medical Association are approved by the board. Graduates of schools outside the United States and Canada are required to pass the E.C.F.V.G. test of the American Veterinary Medical Association as a pre-requisite to eligibility for examination. Temporary permits may be issued by the board but only to graduates of schools in the United States and Canada.

Section VE 2.06 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

VE 2.06 License, failure to renew. Failure to renew a license by December 31 of any year causes automatic expiration of that license. Any person who fails to renew his license by December 31 may be required to pass an examination before a new license will be issued.

Section VE 2.08 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

VE 2.08 Temporary Permit. (1) A graduate of a veterinary college approved by the board who meets all requirements for examination may be granted a temporary permit to practice veterinary medicine until the results of the next examination are known provided he is employed and supervised by a licensed veterinarian.

Applicants for such temporary permit must provide:

- (a) Proof of graduation.
- (b) Permit fee of \$25.00.
- (c) Three letters of recommendation.
- (d) Letter from the licensed veterinarian agreeing to employ and supervise the applicant.

(2) The applicant must personally appear before the board in order to obtain a temporary permit.

(3) A temporary permit shall expire upon:

- (a) Failure of the examination.
- (b) Failure to furnish the National Board score to the board by October 1 of the year in which the examination is taken.

Section VE 2.09 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

VE 2.09 Examination for licensure. The examination will consist of 5 equal parts. One part by each of the 5 professional members of the board. The part prepared by the individual board member will consist of both a written and an oral/practical examination.

- (1) The National Board score shall be reported as a percentage score.
- (2) The Board members shall report one score which shall be arrived at by scoring 20% for the National Board, 40% for the written portion and 40% for the oral/practical portion.
- (3) A score of 70% or better is needed from 3 or more of the examiners before a license will be issued.
- (4) If, due to a conflict of interest, a board member elects to abstain from examining a candidate for licensure, that member's area of the examination will be conducted by the remaining board members.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register or as otherwise provided in section 227.026, Wisconsin Statutes.
