

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 29.085 and 29.174 and chapter 227, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals, renumbers, amends, repeals and recreates and creates rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - NR 10.01 (1) is repealed and recreated to read:

(h) The daily bag limit on Canada geese statewide is not more than that permitted in any one zone within the state and no person may possess or transport more than the daily bag limit or aggregate daily limit, whichever applies, or migratory game birds, tagged or not tagged, at or between the place where taken and either the person's personal abode or temporary or transient place of lodging; or a commercial preservation facility.

(i) The following described area is established as the Horicon intensive management zone:

All that part of the counties of Dodge and Fond du Lac enclosed by a line beginning at the junction of state highway 26, with the east-west center line of sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 in township 12 north, range 15 east, thence eastward along said center line and continuing eastward along the east-west center of

sections 7, 8, 9 and 10 in township 12 north, range 16 east to its junction with county highway TW, thence north and east on said highway TW to its junction with county highway Y, thence northerly on said highway Y to its junction with county highway YY, thence northerly on said highway YY to its junction with county highway Y, thence northerly on said highway Y to its junction with county highway B, thence southwesterly on said highway B to its junction with county highway D, thence westerly on said highway D to its junction with highway AS, thence westerly on said highway AS to its junction with U.S. highway 151, thence southwesterly on said highway 151 to its junction with the C.M.St.P. and Pacific railroad, thence southerly along said C.M.St.P. and Pacific railroad to its junction with state highway 26, thence north on said highway 26 to its junction with the east-west centerline of sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 in township 12 north, range 15 east, which is the point of beginning.

(j) The following described area is established as the Horicon zone:

The Horicon zone is bounded on the east by U.S. highway 45 from Oshkosh to Fond du Lac, and then state highway 175 to Addison; on the south by state highway 33 from Addison to Beaver Dam and then U.S. highway 151 to Columbus; on the west by state highway 73 from Columbus to its intersection with state highway 23 east of Princeton; on the north by state highway 23 from the intersection with state highway 73 to Ripon, then state highway 44 to Oshkosh.

(k) Horicon zone Canada goose hunting permit and tag:

1. It is unlawful to hunt Canada geese in the Horicon zone without being in possession of a special combined goose hunting permit, metal goose tag and report card and valid state hunting license.

Each person desiring to hunt Canada geese in the Horicon zone shall apply for a special combined goose hunting permit, metal tag and report card. Only holders of the current valid hunting license may apply. Application forms

supplied by the department shall be completed and submitted to the department of natural resources by September 20 of each year. It shall be unlawful for any person to submit more than one application per year or an application containing false information. Applications will be available at most department stations and county clerks' offices.

2. If two or more persons wish to hunt together in the Horicon zone, each must fill out an application form and submit them together in one envelope clearly marked "group application" on the outside. Group applications will be considered in the selection as one application.

3. Random selection shall be used to determine successful applicants. Preference for permits shall be given to unsuccessful applicants from the previous year who did not receive a permit.

Unsuccessful applications shall be marked and returned to the applicant. The following year, the applicant shall send a new application, along with the previous year's marked application, and in that manner establish eligibility for preference.

Preference in 1976 shall be established by requiring the applicant to answer questions on the application which will indicate whether the applicant received a permit in 1975 and whether the applicant applied unsuccessfully for a permit in 1975.

4. To be valid, the permit, tag and report card shall remain attached together until a Canada goose is killed. When a Canada goose is killed and before it is carried by hand or transported in any manner, the metal tag with the permit remaining attached shall be locked through the nostrils of the goose. The permit shall then be validated by tearing or cutting out notches designating the month, day and time of kill. Failure to follow the validation procedure in this manner invalidates the permit. Any permit, tag and report card which is detached prior to the kill is an invalid permit.

The permit and tag shall remain attached to the Canada goose until it reaches the abode of the permit holder. The Canada goose shall be transported in a motor vehicle in such a manner that the permit and tag attached to the goose cannot be handled or manipulated by any occupant of the vehicle. The permit, tag and report card are not transferable or replaceable and shall not be reused.

5. Each person hunting in the Horicon zone shall report tag use or nonuse on the report card provided within 12 hours after a Canada goose is killed or the close of the period, whichever occurs first.

6. In the Horicon zone, the hunting period and number of valid permits and tags will be as follows:

All that part of Burnett county lying westerly of a line beginning at the junction of state highway 87 with the south boundary of said county, thence northerly along said highway to its junction with state highway 48, thence northerly along said highway to its junction with state highway 70, thence easterly along said highway to its junction with county highway N, thence northerly along said highway to its junction with county highway D, thence northerly along said highway and continuing northerly along a town road to the south line of section 16, township 39 north, range 17 west, town of Lincoln, thence westerly along a town road to the southwest corner of said section 16, thence northerly along a town road on the west line of said section 16 and continuing northerly along the west line of section 9, township 39 north, range 17 west to the west bank of the Clam river, thence westerly along the west bank of said river to its intersection with the west boundary of said county.

(m) The following described area is established as the Brown county zone:
All that part of Brown county lying north of state highway 29.

(n) The following described area is established as the New Auburn zone:
All those parts of Chippewa, Barron and Rusk counties enclosed by a line beginning at the intersection of state highway 40 and state highway 64 in Chippewa county, thence westerly on said highway 64 to its intersection with U.S. highway 53, thence northerly on said highway 53 to its intersection with county highway D in Barron county, thence easterly on said highway D to its intersection with state highway 40 in Rusk county, thence southerly on said highway 40 to the point of beginning.

(o) The following described area is established as the Rock Prairie zone:
All those parts of Rock and Walworth counties enclosed by a line beginning at the intersection of interstate 90 and the Illinois state line in Rock county, thence northerly on said interstate 90 to its intersection with county highway A, thence easterly on said highway A to the intersection with U.S. highway 12, thence southerly on said highway 12 to its intersection with state highway 50, thence southwesterly on said highway 50 to its intersection with state highway 120, thence southerly on said highway 120 to its intersection with the Illinois state line, thence westerly to the point of beginning.

(p) No person shall hunt migratory waterfowl, coot, rails or gallinules in open water except as provided in NR 10.12(2)(b), Wis. Adm. Code, in the waters of the Mississippi river lying westerly of the Burlington Northern railway wherein it borders on Vernon county during the period beginning October 15 and continuing through the end of the duck season.

SECTION 3 - NR 10.01 (3) (e) 8. is amended to read:

8. Deer quotas for 1976 deer season. The department will issue party permits in sufficient numbers to assure the harvest of the number of deer for each quota area indicated in the following table. Quota areas are composed of single management units or parts of units, the boundaries of which are established in Wis. Adm. Code section NR 10.24. The number of party permits to be issued to harvest the indicated number of deer is determined by an average of the hunter success rates from the most recent 3 previous season with party permits in each quota area or by an average of fewer season where a 3-year average is not available. In estab-

lishing a quota for an area without a prior history of party permits, the average success rates of adjacent quota areas are applied. Party permit success rates used to compute the number of permits to be issued for each management unit are those published by the department in annual deer season reports.

SECTION 4 - NR 10.12 (2) (a), (c), (d) and (e) are amended to read:

(2) Open Water: Exceptions. (a) "Open water" is any water beyond a natural growth of vegetation rooted to the bottom and extending over the water surface. Dead stumps and dead trees in water do not constitute a natural growth of vegetation.

(c) It shall be lawful for any person to hunt wild ducks, wild geese and other aquatic fowl during the open season thereof in open water in any of the outlying waters of Lake Superior and Lake Michigan including Green Bay under the jurisdiction of the state of Wisconsin except the water area within 500 feet of any shoreline of said lakes and except the water area within 500 feet of any natural growth of vegetation rooted to the bottom and extending over the water surface.

(d) Blinds in Calumet, Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties. In any of the waters of Lake Winnebago wherein they border Calumet, Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties it shall be lawful for any person to use blinds that are set, placed or located more than 500 feet from any shoreline, including islands for the purpose of taking, catching, killing and shooting at wild ducks, wild geese or other aquatic fowl. Such blinds may include any boat, canoe, raft or similar device which shall in all instances be securely anchored to the place or spot where they are to be used, and shall be removed from such location at the conclusion of the hunting hours each day.

(e) Blinds in Grant county and Lake Pepin. In any waters of the Mississippi river, wherein they border Grant county and in Pepin, Pierce and Buffalo counties wherein they border Lake Pepin, it shall be lawful for any person to use blinds that are set, placed or located beyond a natural growth of vegetation rooted to the bottom and extending over the water surface for the purpose of taking, catching, killing and shooting at wild ducks, wild geese or other aquatic fowl.

Such blinds may include any boat, canoe, raft, or similar device which shall in all instances be securely anchored to the place or spot they are to be used, and shall be removed from such location at the conclusion of the hunting hours each day.

SECTION 5 - NR 10.15 (6) (a) is amended to read:

(a) With the written approval of the department, an open season may be declared for trapping muskrat, mink and raccoon and for hunting upland game birds and animals within the Horicon national wildlife refuge. If permits are required they shall be issued by the U.S. fish and wildlife service, and shall be subject to all other rules covering hunting and trapping set forth in this chapter, except that the use of wet or dry sets, the number of traps, and the trapping of muskrats in or on muskrat houses or feeder houses, may be authorized by such permit.

This section shall not prohibit the department, its deputies or duly authorized agents, the armed forces of the national guard or the United States army, or any peace officers, or any person summoned by a peace officer to assist in making an arrest or in preserving the peace, from entering and being on such refuges in the performance of official duties.

NR 19.21 Goose damage. (1) The phrase "in or near the area where damage occurs" as found in section 29.594(1)(f), Wis. Stats., is defined to mean any

parcel of land under one ownership within or touching any zone where hunter numbers or concentrations are limited by law.

(2) The term "public hunting" as found in section 29.594(1)(g), Wis. Stats., is defined to mean lands on which the owner or occupant allows hunting for Canada geese by persons other than the immediate family and who have received permission from the owner or occupant to hunt said lands. The owner or occupant may limit such hunting as to time or place, but may not discriminate against persons requesting permission because of their race or religion.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on August 19, 1976.

The rules contained herein shall take effect upon publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
