

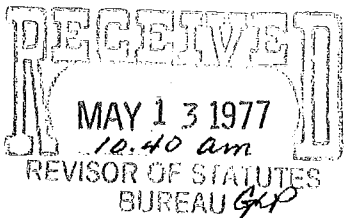

ORDER OF THE EXAMINING BOARD
OF ARCHITECTS, PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS,
DESIGNERS AND LAND SURVEYORS
ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Examining Board of Architects, Professional Engineers, Designers and Land Surveyors by Section 15.08, 227.027, 443.01 and 443.02, Wis. Stats. the Examining Board hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules to read as follows:

I. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.001(2) is amended to read:

- (2) Design services which may be performed by designers, within the meaning and intent of these rules, includes and is limited to the preparation of plans and specifications, and consultation, investigation and evaluation in connection with such preparation of plans and specifications, in the specific fields and subfields as provided for in section A-E 1.20 of these rules.

WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.20(2) is repealed.

WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.20(3) and (4) are amended to read:

- (3) Permit numbers shall designate the fields and subfields to which permits are restricted ~~to~~.
- (4) Designers are restricted to performing such design services as defined in section A-E 1.001(2) of these rules, in those fields and subfields in which they hold a permit, except as those services are exempted by sections 443.01(1)(d), 443.01(9) and 443.01(10) of the Wis. Stats.

II. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.195 is created to read:

A-E 1.195 EVIDENCE OF EDUCATION, TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE TO ACCOMPANY LAND SURVEYOR APPLICATIONS. (1) To be considered by the examining board, an applicant's submittal of an application showing education, training, and experience must include, as a minimum, the following: (a) transcripts verifying applicant's education; (b) references from at least three individuals who shall have personal knowledge of the applicant's experience in land surveying; (c) a chronological history of the applicant's employment; (d) additional data, exhibits or references showing the extent and quality of the applicant's experience in land surveying may be required by the section.

III. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE Sections A-E 1.15(4)(a) and (4)(c)1. are amended to read:

(4) Examinations for Architects. (a) Examination Required. All applicants applying for registration as architects, except those applying under Wis. Stat. section 443.01(11), must complete one 24-hour examination consisting of 3 sections:

Section I: Construction Theory and Practice (7 hours)
Section II: Professional Practice (16 hours)
Section III: Wisconsin Practice (1 hour)

(4)(c)1. Section I of the exam consists of Construction Theory and Practice, 7 hours.

IV. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE Chapter A-E 2 is repealed.

V. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.12 is created to read:

A-E 1.12 Education as an Experience equivalent for Registration as an Architect.

(1) For the purpose of meeting experience requirements for registration as an architect, an applicant may claim certain education as equivalent to experience in architecture, as provided in Wis. Stat. s. 443.01(6)(a)4. To qualify as an education equivalent to architectural experience, such education must be obtained at a university, college or technical school approved by the Architects' Section of the Examining Board.

(2) Each 45 quarter hours or 30 semester hours of credit earned shall be equivalent to one year of work experience, except that the maximum educational equivalent experience shall be:

(a) NAAB Accredited Architectural Degree	5 years
(b) Planning, Architectural Engineering, Structural Engineering or Non-Accredited Architectural Studies Degree	4 years
(c) Courses in Accredited Architecture Program Without Degree	4 years
(d) Planning, Architectural Engineering, Structural Engineering or Non-Accredited Architectural Studies Courses Without Degree	3 years
(e) Other Bachelor Degrees	3 years
(f) Other Courses Without Degree	2 years
(g) Accredited Master of Architecture Degree Subsequent to Accredited Bachelor of Architecture Degree	Considered as 1/2 year of Practical Experience

VI. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.13 is created to read:

A-E 1.13 Architectural Experience


- (1) To qualify as satisfactory experience in architectural work for the purpose of meeting registration requirements of Wis. Stat. s. 443.01 (6)(a) such experience shall include the application of architectural principles and data and shall demonstrate applicant's progressive development of competence to do architectural work.
- (2) Satisfactory work experience shall consist of related practical training including at least one year of experience in the design and construction of buildings preferably under the supervision of a then registered architect, professional engineer, or exempt person as defined in s. 443.01(9), Wis. Stats. prior or subsequent to acquisition of approved educational equivalents.
- (3) To qualify as satisfactory architectural experience employment must consist of at least two or more continuous months.
- (4) Full or partial credit may be allowed for part-time (20-hours/week minimum) work experience, and architectural related teaching or research (with degree) subject to review by the Architects' Section.

VIII. WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE s. A-E 1.20(5)(c) and (d) is amended to read:

- (c) A chronological history of the applicant's employment; and
- (d) Additional data, exhibits or references showing the extent and quality of the applicant's technological experience. may be required by the section.

The rules and amendments contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following their publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register.
