

Dear Mr. Poulson:

When Wisconsin Administrative Code section Ins 3.39 Standards for accident and sickness insurance sold to the Medicare eligible was adopted, specific captions to be included in insurance policies issued in Wisconsin were set out in several parts of the rule. Part of several of those captions includes the word "not" which was underlined in the Order filed with the Secretary of State and with your office. However, the printer in each case printed the underlined words in italics. We understand this is the usual way that underlined words are printed and that a special note should be made if a word is to be underlined in the final printed rule. At this time, will you change the word "not" in the following parts of Ins 3.39 so that rather than being italicized it will be printed in regular type and underlined. The change should be made in:

We have also noticed that the caption specified in subsection (7) (b) [second and third sentences] includes the word "not" twice, but neither were underlined in the Order although both should have been. Likewise the caption specified in subsection (9) (a) [second sentence] includes the word "not" which should have been underlined. If these words can also be underlined in the printed code it would be helpful.
