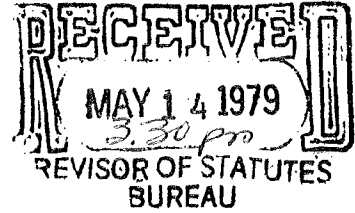

VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD  
ORDER ADOPTING EMERGENCY RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Veterinary Examining Board by sections 15.08 and 227.07, Wis. Stats., the Veterinary Examining Board hereby adopts emergency rules to read as follows:

Section VE 2.09 of WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

VE 2.09 Examination for licensure. The examination will consist of 5 equal parts. One part by each of the 5 professional members of the board. The part prepared by the individual board member. Each part will consist of both a written and an oral/practical examination approved by the board.

(1) The board members Each examiner shall report one score which shall be arrived at by scoring 50% for the written and 50% for the oral/practical portion.

(2) A score of 70% or better is needed from 3 or more of the examiners before a license will be issued.

(3) If, due to a conflict of interest, an examiner board member elects to abstain from examining a candidate for licensure, that member's area of the examination will be conducted by the remaining board members examiners.

The Veterinary Examining Board finds that an emergency exists and that the above rule amendments are necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare. A statement of the facts constituting the emergency is:

(1) That on August 11, 1978, the governor appointed a veterinarian to the Veterinary Examining Board,

(2) That on December 20, 1978, that veterinarian withdrew his name from consideration by the Senate.

(3) That on July 1, 1977, the term of a professional member of the Veterinary Examining Board expired. The board member agreed to continue serving as a member of the board until a replacement was appointed.

(4) That on April 15, 1979, the above mentioned veterinarian submitted his resignation as a member of the board.

(5) That the Veterinary Examining Board has vacancies for two professional members, and;

(6) That the board's administrative rules state that the veterinarian licensing examination will consist of 5 equal parts, one part prepared by each board member.

(7) That under the current rules, the board is unable to give a 5 part examination for the next licensing examination, June 19-22, 1979.


(8) That the board as presently constituted is not qualified by reason of the existing administrative rules to give a complete examination.

(9) That protection of the welfare of the public, including candidates who are qualified to enter the examination in June, 1979 and users of the services which would be made available after licensure by these candidates necessitates that the rule on the veterinarian examination requirements, set forth above, be put into effect prior to the time it could be put into effect if the board were to comply with the notice of hearing and publication requirements of Chapter 227, Wis. Stats.

The emergency rules contained herein shall take effect on June 12, 1979.
