

## ORDER OF THE Chiropractic Examining Board AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Chiropractic Examining Board by sections 15.08(5) Wis. Stats. the Board hereby amends and repeals rules as follows:

Section Chir 3.05 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Chir 3.05 Unprofessional conduct. The following enumerated acts are considered to be unprofessional and will result in desciplinary action by the board.

Sections Chir 3.05(1)(b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (i), (j), (m) and (n) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are repealed.

Sections Chir 3.05(1)(g), (h) and (k) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are relettered (b), (c) and (d) respectively.

Section Chir 3.05(9m) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section Chir 3.05(13) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section Chir 3.08 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Chir 3.08 Continuing education requirements for license renewal. As a condition for renewing a license, each resident licensee shall submit to the board satisfactory evidence that said licensee has attended within the preceding 2 year period, 24 hours of instruction in subjects relating to chiropractic and approved by the board. Said instruction must be under the supervision of college instructors, or the continuing education faculty of board approved chiropractic colleges, at a seminar given by the Wisconsin Chiropractic Association, chiropractic examining board, American Chiropractic Association, International Chiropractic Association, or at a board-approved chiropractic college. Credits may be earned either from one session or accumulated from several sessions during that 2 year period. The board may, in its discretion, waive said educational requirements for the licensee by reason of an unforeseeable and unusual emergency.
