Relating to rules concerning the examining board's 2 year academic requirement for licensure as a funeral director and embalmer.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

The Funeral Directors and Embalmers Examining Board is proposing an amendment to FDE 2.03 to combine related prelicensure educational requirements currently in FDE 2.05(2) within one rule to eliminate repetition and simplify procedures applicants must follow in providing evidence of meeting the board's academic requirements.

ORDER

Now therefore it is ordered that pursuant to sections 227.014 and 156.03, Stats., the Funeral Directors and Embalmers Examining Board hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules interpreting section 156.045(1)(d), Stats., as follows:

Section FDE 2.03 of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

FDE 2.03 Two academic years of academic college instruction. The following or courses equivalent to shall be accepted by the board as proof To meet the requirements of 2 academic years of academic instruction as stated specified in s. 156.045(1)(d), Stats. an applicant must submit to the board an official transcript of courses from a college or university recognized by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, showing that the applicant has completed At least the number of semester credit hours shown below in the following areas:

Section FDE 2.05(2) of the Wisconsin administrative code is repealed.

The rule adoption and repeals contained in this proposed order shall take effect pursuant to section 227.014, Stats.
