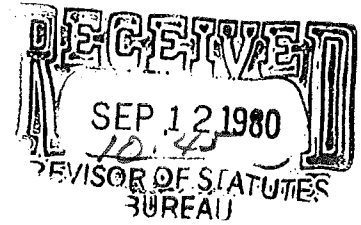

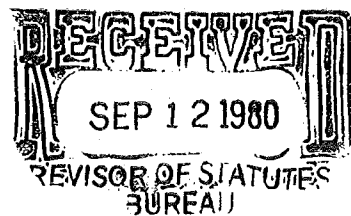

IN THE MATTER OF RULEMAKING : ORDER OF THE MEDICAL EXAMINING
PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE : BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING OR
MEDICAL EXAMINING BOARD : ADOPTING RULES

Relating to rules concerning applicants who have met written examination requirements in Canada for licensure to practice medicine and surgery.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

A rule amendment and new subsections, interpreting s. 448.05(6)(a) of the statutes, are proposed to specify that the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board will not require further written examinations by applicants who have passed written examinations prepared by the Medical Council of Canada on or after January 1, 1978.

Prior to that date, the board's review of the Canadian council's examination determined that the examination was not substantially equivalent to other examinations approved by the board and applicants who had taken the Canadian examination were not eligible for licensure without further examination.

The rule amendment and new subsections indicate clearly the board's acceptance of the Canadian Medical Council's recent examinations as equivalent to other board-approved examinations.

ORDER

Now therefore it is ordered that pursuant to authority vested in the Medical Examining Board under sections 15.08(5), 227.014 and 448.04, Wis. Stats., the Medical Examining Board amends and adopts rules interpreting section 448.05(6)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes as follows:

1. Section Med 1.06(3)(b) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

(b) An applicant who has passed all 3 parts of the examinations of either the National Board of Medical Examiners or the National Board of Examiners for Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons; the following boards and councils may submit to the board verified documentary evidence thereof, and the board will accept this in lieu of requiring further written examination of the applicant:—

2. Sections Med 1.06(3)(b)1., 2. and 3. of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are created to read:

1. National Board of Medical Examiners;

2. National Board of Examiners for Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons; or

3. Medical Council of Canada, if the examination is taken on or after January 1, 1978.

The rule amendment and adoption contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following its publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Wis. Stats.
