REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, AND REPEALING & RECREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing sections NR 10.01(1)(b) thru (g), NR 10.01(1)(1)3.b. intro. & 3.c., NR 11.06(2), (4) & (5)(b), NR 11.11, NR 11.17(5), (6) & (7), NR 11.21(1)(a)3. & 6., NR 11.24(1)(a), (b) & (c), (5) & (7)(b), NR 15.01(43)(a) & (c) and (51), and NR 15.02(78)(b); renumbering sections NR 10.01(1)(1)3.b.1) thru 5); amending sections NR 10.01(1)(1)5., 6.b. and NR 10.12 (3)(b); and repealing and recreating sections G-57-79 NR 10.01(1)(j) & (k), NR 10.01(1)(1) intro., 1. & 2. and 8., NR 10.01(2)(a)1. & (3)(b), NR 10.07(1)(g), NR 10.101(1)(b) & (3)(b), NR 10.201, NR 11.21(1)(a)4. & 5., NR 15.02(63) and NR 15.03 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to regulation changes for the 1980 hunting season

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

1. The revisions made in the regulations for hunting Canada geese in Wisconsin include revisions in the boundaries for the Horicon Zone and the Central Zone in addition to the following:

Horicon Zone: Two hunting periods will be offered with the following permit limits:

<u>Date</u>	Season Limit	Permits to be Issued
Oct. 1 Noon - Oct. 31 Nov. 1 - Dec. 9	1 2	18,000 11,000

The season runs for 70 consecutive days and does not follow the split season framework. Permits will be issued by random drawing from applications received no later than September 10. Applications received after September 10 will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis, if any unfilled permits remain. The deadline for applications is September 30.

Central Zone: The season follows the duck season framework opening on October 1 at noon through October 7 and October 13 through December 9 with all successful applicants receiving two tags. Hunters receiving tags in the Central Zone will not be eligible to receive tags in the Horicon Zone. The application deadline is September 30. Permits will be issued to 22,300 applicants in the Central Zone.

2. The Saturday nearest October 1 through January 31 season zone for ruffed grouse is expanded by establishing a road boundary which would add all or a portion of 32 counties to this zone. Waukesha County would remain closed. The effect of this change would be to add 31 days of hunting recreation to those counties and clarify the zone boundary. Providing additional public hunting opportunities within the biological capabilities of the species is the justification for the proposal.

- 3. The county or adjoining county restrictions imposed on bobcat registration are eliminated, and registration will be allowed in <u>any</u> county. It has been recognized that sportsmen have difficulty in registering bobcats within the county or adjoining county of kill. Registration stations have been limited to certain DNR offices and normal office hours. By eliminating the restriction and providing wider distribution of registration materials, the Department can provide better service.
- 4. A uniform Saturday closest to October 15 opening date for raccoon hunting and trapping is established. Considerable concern has been expressed by sportsmen, the Wisconsin Trappers Association and the Fur Harvest Study Committee of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress regarding the early start of the raccoon season and its impact on fur primeness as well as excessive trapping and hunting pressure. This recommendation would delay the northern zone by two weeks, therefore, coinciding with better fur primeness conditions while reducing hunting and trapping pressure within a uniform statewide season. The recommendation received a plurality of county approvals over two other options presented (public hearings were held in each county of the state).
- 5. Bait materials used for hunting any wildlife species are restricted to apples, pastry or liquid scent (excluding honey). Placement restrictions identical to bear hunting shall also apply to this rule. Differences that exist between bear baiting rules and those for other hunting (primarily coyotes) have caused confusion by hunters, as well as loopholes in the bear baiting rule. For example, all baiting is limited to apples, pastry and liquid scent north of highway 29 from August 18 through September 23. There are no baiting restrictions for other wildlife except during this same period. As a result, a violator can easily place illegal materials for attracting bear under the guise of hunting other species (fox or coyote). The vast majority of hunters pursuing other game animals do not use bait. Therefore, only a small segment of hunters would be affected by this rule. Such change would not affect the use of bait for trapping purposes.
- 6. The present bear-dog training period is expanded by three weeks. Present regulations allow only a 3-week period for training bear-dogs running from August 1 to the beginning of the pre-season baiting period. The regulations are virtually unenforceable because there are no restrictions on training dogs for other forms of hunting. In addition, the short training period is an inadequate time for training and evaluating a bear-dog. A 3-week extension would provide approximately a 6-week training period which would greatly improve compliance with the law and meet the need for training bear hunting dogs.

The deletions are to eliminate areas where protection is no longer needed or when land use changes have occurred to such an extent that the area no longer meets the requirements of the rule. Modifications, including additions, are made to satisfy new protection requirements needed by sharptailed grouse (game species) or cormorants (Wis. threatened species).

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 29.085, 29.174, 29.255, 29.415 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals, renumbers, amends, and repeals and recreates rules interpreting sections 23.09, 29.174 and 29.255, Wisconsin Statutes, as follows:

Note: Migratory bird regulations, including seasons, limits, hours and areas where authorized, are established by emergency rule procedure in September of each year. - 2. Use any bait material for attracting wild animals other than apples, pastry or liquid scent. Such apples and pastry shall be confined to a hole in the ground measuring no more than 2 feet square.
- 3. Place or hunt over bait or liquid scent within 50 yards of any trail, road or campsite used by the public.
- 4. Exception: This subsection does not prohibit hunting over bait materials deposited by natural vegetation or found solely as a result of normal agricultural practices.
