

Pursuant to the provisions of section 101.15 (2) (b), 101.19 (1) and 168.12, Stats., the department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations proposes to repeal and recreate sections in Wisconsin Administrative Code chapter Ind 69 - Fee Schedule.

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Ind 69 - Fee Schedule

Section Ind 69.001 is created to read:

Ind 69.001 SCOPE. The fees established in the following sections of this code shall be paid to the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations for providing those services authorized in the Wisconsin Statutes.

Note #2: All checks or money orders are to be made payable to Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations.

Section Ind 69.01 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.01 FEE ADJUSTMENT. (1) The fees, as specified in this code, shall be charged from the effective date of this code through June 30, 1981.

- (2) Effective July 1, 1981, and thereafter, the fees specified in this code shall be adjusted by the same percentage amounts, and on the same effective dates, as changes occur in the pay rate of employes of the state of Wisconsin.

Section Ind 69.02 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.02 HANDLING, COPYING AND MISCELLANEOUS FEES.

- (1) Handling Fees. The department may charge a \$10.00 handling fee to offset administrative costs.
- (2) Photocopying Fees. A photocopying fee of \$.10/page may be charged.
- (3) Plan Reproduction Fees. A fee of \$3.50/sheet will be charged for plan reproduction.
- (4) Microfilm Fees. Microfilm prints of approved plans for the years 1967-1972 are available at the cost of reproduction.

Section Ind 69.03 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.03 BOILERS, PRESSURE VESSELS AND WISCONSIN SPECIAL VESSELS. (1) Boiler Inspection Fees. Inspection fees for boilers will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

- (3) Wisconsin Special Vessel Plan Examination. Plan examination fees will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

- (4) Reinspection Fee. A fee of \$18.00 shall be assessed for inspections made by the department to gain compliance with the rules of chapters Ind 41-42. Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code, after orders have been issued by the department.
- (5) Registration Fee. The installing contractor of a new or second-hand boiler or pressure vessel shall register the installation with the department before the equipment is placed in operation. The registration fee shall be \$10.00.
- (6) Alteration and Repair Fees. An owner, manufacturer or contractor reporting alteration or repair to a boiler or pressure vessel, as required by the provisions of chapter Ind 42, shall pay a fee of \$10.00 with each alteration or repair report.
- (7) Certificate of Operation. The certificate of operation fee shall be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Authorized inspector employed by the department	\$10.00
(b) Certified inspector employed by an insurance company or agency	\$15.00

- (8) Fee for Failure to Have Boiler or Pressure Vessel Ready for Inspection. The owner shall pay a fee equal to 50% of the applicable inspection fee for failure to have the boiler or pressure vessel ready for inspection on the date specified unless the owner notifies the department, in writing, 7 days prior to the specified inspection date.

Section Ind 69.035 is created to read:

Ind 69.035 WELDER CERTIFICATION FEES. Persons desiring to be certified as a structural welder shall submit with the proper form a fee of \$15.00

Section Ind 69.04 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.04 MECHANICAL REFRIGERATION SYSTEMS. (1) Inspection Fees. The inspection fees, based on the aggregate tonnage of the mechanical refrigeration system, shall be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

Capacity in tons	Inspection fee
(a) Less than 3	No fee
(b) 3 thru 25	\$15.00
(c) 26 thru 100	\$25.00
(d) 101 thru 250	\$35.00
(e) 251 thru 500	\$60.00
(f) 501 thru 750	\$80.00
(g) 751 thru 1000	\$90.00
(h) Over 1000	\$110.00

Note: For the purpose of assessing the inspection fee, the capacity of a mechanical refrigeration system will be determined in tons. One ton of refrigeration capacity shall be the equivalent of abstracting heat at the rate of 12,000 Btu per hour.

- (2) Certificate of Operation. The department will issue a certificate of operation upon receipt of a \$10.00 fee for each mechanical refrigeration system and the inspection report indicating the equipment satisfies the minimum operating standards specified in Chapter Ind 45, Mechanical Refrigeration Code.

- (3) Registration Fee. The installing contractor of a mechanical refrigeration system shall register the equipment with the department before the equipment is put in operation. The registration fee shall be \$10.00.

Section Ind 69.05 is amended to read:

Ind 69.05 ANHYDROUS AMMONIA SYSTEMS. (1) Plan Examination Fee. The owner or user shall submit a fee of \$40.00 for plan examination of each new anhydrous ammonia handling or storage facility.

- (2) Inspection Fee. A fee of \$40.00 for the external inspection of each new anhydrous ammonia tank and system shall be submitted at the time of plan approval. Anhydrous ammonia systems shall not be put into operation until the inspection has been conducted by the department.

Section Ind 69.06 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.06 ELEVATORS, POWER DUMBWAITERS, ESCALATORS, MOVING WALKS AND RAMPS, PERSONNEL HOISTS, LIFTS FOR THE PHYSICALLY DISABLED AND MATERIAL LIFTS.

- (1) Plan Examination and Application Fees. Fees for the examination of plans or application or both submitted in accordance with the requirements of chapter Ind 4 - Elevator, shall be determined at the rate of 8/10 of 1% of the cost. The minimum fee shall be \$25.00.
- (2) New Installation Inspection Fees. Inspection fees for new installations shall be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Initial Inspection

- 1. Class 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 (4 landings or less \$50.00
 - a. Plus fee for each additional landing \$ 3.00
 - b. Plus fee for units with special emergency service \$25.00
- 2. Class 2A and 5 \$25.00
- 3. Class 4 and 8 - See fees for special inspections, Ind 69.15

(b) Reinspections to Determine Compliance

- 1. Class 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 8 \$25.00
- 2. Class 2A and 5 \$15.00

(3) Periodic Inspection Fees. Fees for periodic inspections will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Periodic Inspection

- 1. Class 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 (4 Landings or less \$20.00
 - a. Plus fee for each additional landing \$ 3.00
- 2. Class 2A and 5 \$15.00
- 3. Class 4 and 8 - See fees for special inspections, Ind 69.15

- (b) Reinspection to determine compliance with requirements of periodic inspection for all units \$15.00

Note #1: Following is an identification of the various classes included in Ind 69.06 (2) and (3):

- Class 1 - Freight elevators (single belt, double belt and cable control elevators) with 4 landings or less, sidewalk elevators, sidewalk type elevators and grade level elevators;
- Class 2 - Passenger and all other freight elevators not in Class 1 with 4 landings or less;
- Class 2A - Lifting devices used by the physically disabled;
- Class 3 - Material lifts with 4 landings or less;
- Class 4 - Personnel hoists;
- Class 5 - Hand power elevators;
- Class 6 - Dumbwaiters (power) with 4 landings or less;
- Class 7 - Escalators, moving walks and moving ramps per unit. A single section having a travel of one floor defines an escalator unit;
- Class 8 - Television towers and other tower elevators.

Note #2: Any elevator or dumbwaiter classification may be identified by number of landings. Example: A 6-landing passenger elevator would be classified as Class 2-6.

(3) Certificate of Operation. The certificate fee will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

Section Ind 69.08 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.08 CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AND INSURANCE COMPANY ASSESSMENTS.

(1) Certificates of Competency. Insurance company employes eligible to be examined for competency as a boiler or elevator inspectors shall submit with the proper application form, an examination fee of \$50.00.

- (a) Boiler inspectors receiving a reciprocal certificate of competency by qualifying as a member of the National Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Inspectors shall submit with their application form a fee of \$40.00.
- (b) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination need not submit an additional examination fee when the application for reexamination is filed within 12 months from the date of the previous examination.
- (c) The annual renewal fee for certificates of competency is \$20.00.

(2) Insurance Company Inspection Assessments. The department may inspect any installation which is also inspected by a certified inspector employed by an insurance company or agency. When the department inspection confirms that the insurance inspection report is incomplete, invalid or unacceptable the department will assess the insurance company or agency a fee in accordance with the schedules in sections Ind 69.03 or Ind 69.06 (2).

Section Ind 69.09 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.09 BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES, HEATING AND VENTILATING. (1) Plan Examination. Fees for the examination and approval of all plans submitted in accordance with the requirements of chapters Ind 50-64 will be determined in accordance with the following schedules.

- (a) Building, heating and ventilating. Fees for the examination and approval of all building and heating and ventilating plans will be computed on the basis of the total volume of the building and at the following rates:

Note: See section Ind 51.01 (139a) for the definition of the term "Volume".

1. Exceptions.

- a. Warehouses. The fees for plan examination and approval of warehouses shall be determined in accordance with Ind 69.09 (1) (a) except that the fee may be reduced by 30%. Minimum fee - \$50.00.
 - b. Replacement of heating equipment. The replacement of a boiler or a furnace in an existing heating system with no alterations to the heating system requires no fee. See Ind 69.03 (5) for registration fee for boilers and pressure vessels.
- (b) Permit to start \$60.00 per permit
- (c) Alteration plans for buildings and structures and heating and ventilating may be determined in accordance with (1) (a), based on total building volume affected by such alteration, or the following:
- \$2.00 for every \$1000 or fraction of \$1000 estimated cost. Minimum fee - \$35.00 per plan.
- (Estimated fee need not include cost of razing, piping, electrical, painting or decorating.)
- (d) Revisions to previously examined plans . \$35.00 per plan
- Applies when plans are revised, for reasons other than those that were requested by the department, before construction of the specific item commences.)
- (e) Footing and foundation plans submitted separately \$75.00 per plan
- (f) Structural plans. The fees for the examination and approval of structural plans shall be determined in accordance with the following:

Note: Applies to trusses, precast concrete, laminated wood beams, and other structural elements when submitted separately and not included with general building plans.

- 1. One Building - one structural plan containing identical structural elements \$25 per plan per building
- 2. One Building - one structural plan containing more than one structural element \$35 per plan per building
- 3. Multi-building Project - one structural plan containing identical structural elements for all buildings - structural plans submitted for all buildings in one submittal \$35 per plan per building
- 4. Multi-building Project - one structural plan containing identical structural elements for all buildings, however a structural plan submitted separately for each building or a portion of the total project \$35 per plan submitted per building or group of buildings in one submittal
- 5. Multi-building Project - one structural plan containing more than one structural element per building submitted for all buildings in one submittal \$45 per plan for the entire project
- 6. Multi-building Project - one structural plan containing more than one structural element per building, however a structural plan submitted separately for each building or a portion of the project \$45 per plan submittal per building or group of buildings in one submittal

- (g) Fire escapes \$35.00 per plan
- (h) Stadia, grandstands and bleachers \$14.00 per 1000 seats or fraction of 1000 seats. Minimum fee - \$35.00
- (i) Industrial exhaust systems for dusts, fumes, vapors and gases (government owned only) \$35.00 per plan
- (j) Spray booth plans (government owned only) \$35.00 per plan

(2) Approval Numbers. The fee for approval numbers issued by the department for the approval of materials, equipment and devices

- (a) New Approval \$300.00 per approval
- (b) Renewal of Approval \$150.00 per approval

(3) Inspection Fees. Field inspection fees shall be submitted for each building or structure in accordance with the following schedules:

(a) General building, heating and ventilating inspection fees. When plans for the building and the heating and ventilating system are submitted together, inspection fees shall be determined in accordance with the following:

(c) Inspection fees for alterations to existing buildings. Inspection fees for alterations to existing buildings shall be determined in accordance with (3) (a) or the following:

(d) Miscellaneous inspection fees. Miscellaneous inspection fees include inspections for fire escapes, stadia and grandstands, exhaust systems, spray booths and other structures for which plan submission is required \$35.00

- (4) Manufactured multi-family dwelling fees. Fees related to plan examination, inplant and field inspections, inspector certification, Wisconsin insignias, and materials approval shall be submitted in accordance with the following:
- (a) Plan examination and approval See s. Ind 69.09 (1) (a)-(g).
 - (b) Field inspection See s. Ind 69.09 (3).
 - (c) Wisconsin insignia \$10.00 per living unit.
 - (d) In-plant inspections by department . . \$15.00 per hour plus travel expenses
 - (e) Materials approval \$300.00 per model
 - (f) Certified inspector

- (5) Collection of Fees. All fees shall be remitted at the time the plans are submitted. No plan examinations, approvals or inspections will be made until the fees are received.
- (6) Microfilm Fees. Microfilm prints of approved plans for the years 1967-1972 are available at the cost of reproduction.
- (7) Petitions for Modification. The department will consider and may grant modification to an administrative rule upon receipt of a maximum fee of \$200.00, a completed petition for modification form from the owner, and a position statement from the fire department having responsibility and an interest in the rule, provided an equivalency is established in the petition for modification which meets the intent of the rule being petitioned. A refund may be returned for petitions, where the department's actual cost is less than the fee specified.
- (8) Inspection and Copying of Plans and Specifications. The department shall allow inspection and copying of all plans, specifications and related materials filed with the department, except as follows:

- (a) The department may restrict on a case by case basis, the right of inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials where the possible harm to the public interest outweighs the benefits of inspection or copying. The department will restrict inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials for the following types of buildings:
1. Banks, savings and loans, credit unions, securities dealers and other types or parts of buildings where large sums of money, negotiable securities or valuables are stored in secured areas;
 2. Jails and other correctional institutions;
 3. Public facilities regularly used for the storage or evaluation of evidence in criminal proceedings;
 4. Armories;
 5. Public broadcasting facilities;
 6. Power generating facilities; and
 7. Museums and libraries.
- (b) The department shall allow inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials of all buildings in response to lawful subpoena, or in response to written requests from law enforcement agencies.
- (c) Prior to any inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials, a written, signed application shall be obtained from the person requesting the inspection or copying. The application shall contain a general description of the premises for which inspection or copying is requested and the full name and address of the requester. The written request shall contain a statement that any information obtained from the inspection or copying shall not be used for any unlawful purpose or unfair competitive practice, and that the information set out therein is true and correct. The department will consider the information supplied in the request in conjunction with the type of buildings noted in subsection Ind 69.09 (7) (a) in determining whether the request for inspection or copying shall be granted. The department shall promptly transmit a copy of this statement to the owner and submitter of the documents being inspected or copied.
- (d) The department may charge a reasonable amount to defray its costs in providing copies.

Section Ind 69.10 is amended to read:

Ind 69.10 STORAGE TANKS: FLAMMABLE AND COMBUSTIBLE LIQUIDS, LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS AND LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS. (1) Plan Examination Fees. Fees for the examination of plans for tanks used for the storage of flammable and combustible liquids, liquefied petroleum gas and liquefied natural gas will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) Flammable and combustible liquids (tank capacity):
 - 1. 100,000 gallons or less \$20.00 each
 - 2. Over 100,000 gallons \$45.00 each
 - (b) Liquefied petroleum gas and liquefied natural gas \$30.00 each
 - (c) Revisions to previously approved plans . . \$15.00 revised plan
- (2) Inspection Service Fee. An inspection service fee of \$30.00 for each tank at bulk plants, service stations or other locations shall be paid at the time the plans are submitted.

Section Ind 69.11 is amended to read:

Ind 69.11 PETROLEUM PRODUCTS. (1) Petroleum Product Inspection Fee. A petroleum product inspection fee shall be paid to the department.

- (a) Except as provided in (b), the fee shall be 2-3/4 cents for each 50 gallons of petroleum product from which a sample is taken.
 - (b) (Effective July 1, 1981, the fee shall be 3 cents for each 50 gallons of petroleum product from which a sample is taken.
- (2) Certification Fee for Petroleum Product Users. Persons applying for certification or recertification as a petroleum product user shall submit with the application for certification or recertification an annual fee (determined from the date of certification) of \$200 for each separate storage location.

Section Ind 69.12 is amended to read:

Ind 69.12 SELF-SERVICE STATIONS. (1) Plan Examination Fee. A fee of \$15.00 shall be remitted for the plan examination of each self-service station, or revision to a previously approved plan.

- (2) Inspection Fee. An inspection fee of \$30.00 for each self-service station shall be remitted at the time the plans are submitted.

Section Ind 69.13 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.13 SKI LIFTS AND TOWING DEVICES. (1) Plan Examination Fee. Fees for the examination of plans will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

Note: See section Ind 47.02 for definition of the term "Amusement Ride" as it applies to ski lift and towing devices used as amusement rides.

- (a) Gondola lifts and rides \$200.00/plan
- (b) Chair lifts and rides \$150.00/plan
- (c) Surface tows except fiber and wire rope tows \$100.00/plan
- (d) Fiber and wire rope tows \$ 60.00/plan

(2) Inspection Fees. Fees for the inspection of new installations, annual inspections and other inspections will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

Note: See section Ind 47.02 for definition of the term "Amusement Ride" as it applies to ski lift and towing devices used as amusement rides.

Note: Surface tows include T-bar, platter, and similar devices.

(3) Load Test Fee. The fee for certifying load test will be \$100.00.

(4) Certificate of Operation. The department will issue a certificate of operation upon receipt of a \$10.00 fee for each device and the inspection report indicating the device(s) satisfy the minimum operating standards specified in Chapter Ind 46, Towing and Lifting Devices for Ski Areas.

Section Ind 69.14 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.14 SPECIAL INSPECTIONS. Fees for special inspections for alterations, fabrication, repairs, testing and quality assurance methods that are provided on request will be charged as follows:

- (1) For individual special inspections performed between the hours of 7:45 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on weekday Monday through Friday \$18.00/hour per inspector.
- (2) For individual special inspections performed on Saturdays, Sundays, holidays and at times other than scheduled in (1) \$27.00/hour per inspector.
- (3) For supervising the American Society of Mechanical Engineers joint review and audit and for conducting shop audits, Monday through Friday \$25.00/hour per inspector.
- (4) For costs incurred in the performance of special inspections, an additional amount will be charged to cover expenses, including travel time, mileage, meals and lodging. Travel expenses, however, will be limited to those allowed under department employe travel regulations.

Section Ind 69.15 is repealed and recreated to read:

Ind 69.15 PETITIONS FOR MODIFICATION. The department will consider and may grant modification to an administrative rule upon receipt of a fee of \$200.00, a completed petition for modification form from the owner, and a position statement from the fire department having responsibility and an interest in the rule, provided an equivalency is established in the petition for modification which meets the intent of the rule being petitioned. A refund may be returned for petitions, where the department's actual cost is less than the fee specified.

Section Ind 69.16 is repealed and recreated to read:
