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AMENDING RULES

IN THE MATTER of amending section NR 25.03(1)		
of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining	•	
to criteria for reissuing Lake Superior commer-		F-58-79

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

The rule amends section NR 25.03(1), Wis. Adm. Code, to modify relicensing criteria for commercial fishing on Lake Superior. The criteria are simplified to provide one set of criteria rather than a progression of criteria through several years as was previously the case. The total number of licenses is established in the existing rule; therefore, these rules are no longer necessary as all participants have met the criteria for relicensing for a number of years.

Pursuant to s. 29.33(7), Stats., the Lake Superior Commercial Fishing Board has made this recommendation and solicited an affirmative response from the Natural Resources Board.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 29.33 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends rules interpreting section 29.33, Wisconsin Statutes, as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section NR 25.03 (1) is amended to read:

- (1) Lake Superior. (a) Not more than 21 licenses authorizing commercial fishing on Lake Superior may be issued for each license year.
- (b) Applications for licenses authorizing commercial fishing on Lake
 Superior which have been filed in accordance with sub. (3) shall be reviewed
 and approved or denied pursuant to the following criteria:
- 1. For the first year of eligibility the applicant must show proof of a \$5,000 investment in commercial fishing equipment.
- 2. To retain eligibility for the second year and each consecutive year period thereafter, the applicant must show proof of:

- a. A \$5,000 investment in commercial fishing equipment.
- b. At least 50 days of commercial-fishing, setting or operating nets on Lake Superior during the previous year.

c--A-catch-value-of-63,000-from-bake-Superior-during-the-previous-year.

3--To-retain-eligibility-for-the-third-year,-the-applicant-must-show-proof
of:

a.-A-\$7,500-investment-in-commercial-fishing-equipment.

br-Fifty-days-of-commercial-fishing,-setting-or-operating-nets-on-Lake Superior-during-the-previous-year.

e--A-eateh-value-of-\$3,000-from-bake-Superior-during-the-previous-year4--To-retain-eligibility-for-the-fourth-year-the-applicant-must-show-proof
of:

a.-A-\$10,000-investment-in-commercial-fishing-equipment-

b.-Fifty_days-of-fishing-experience;-setting-or-operating-nets-on-Lake
Superior-during-the-previous-year.

e--A-catch-value-of-\$3,000-from-Lake-Superior-during-the-previous-year5--To-retain-eligibility-for-the-fifth-year-period-and-thereafter,-the

b.-Seventy-five-days-of-fishing-experience,-setting-or-operating-nets-on

e--A-eateh-valueof-\$5,000-from-Lake-Superior-during-the-previous-year-

6. 3. Any licensee failing to meet the qualifications of subds. (b) 1.

and 2. to-5. shall not be eligible to reapply for such license until one year
has elapsed since the end of the period in which that person was licensed.

7. 4. Such licenses shall be issued according to the following priorities to applicants otherwise qualified.

- a. First to individuals who have been licensed on Lake Superior or worked as crew members setting and operating nets at least 100 days in total during the 2 preceding years.
- b. Next to individuals who have held a license on Lake Superior or worked as a member of a crew on Lake Superior for 2 years.
- c. Next to other Wisconsin residents and nonresidents residing in states allowing Wisconsin residents similar privileges.
- 8. 5. When the number of qualified new applicants for such license shall exceed the number of licenses available and such applicants are not affected by the priorities established in (7) subd. 4. the licenses shall be awarded on the basis of random selection from all eligible applications received.
- (c) The Lake Superior commercial fishing board shall review applications for licenses and recommend approval or denial of licenses to the department no later than May 20 preceding the license year for which application is being made.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on February 28, 1980.

The rules contained herein shall take effect upon publication as required in section 227.026(1) intro., Wisconsin Statutes.
