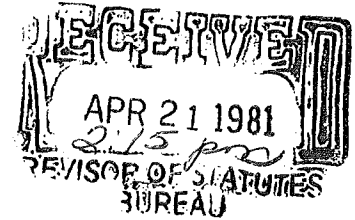



ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
AMENDING AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER OF amending sections NR 10.01(1) .
intro para., NR 10.01(1)(a), NR 10.01(1)(1)1., .

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Following are the significant changes for the 1980 migratory bird season:

1. Duck Season - The federal framework is similar to 1979 for both the point system and conventional bag options. Wisconsin has chosen the point system option with point values the same as 1979 except for redhead ducks which drop from 100 to 70 points.

The 50-day season begins at noon October 6 and continues through November 24. Closed areas for canvasback ducks are established where fall concentrations exceed certain levels.
2. Special Scaup Season - This season runs for 16 days in selected waters following the close of the duck season as it has in previous years.
3. Canada Geese - A 50-day season is applied to the Horicon, Central, Brown County and Rock Prairie Zones along with sixteen counties in east-central Wisconsin. The remainder of the state has a 70-day season. All seasons commence at noon, October 6.

Permit procedures for the Horicon and Central Zones are similar to 1979. The number of permits to be issued are:
 - a. Horicon - 25,000 (Two periods: Oct. 6-31 and Nov. 1-24)
 - b. Central - 30,300
4. Other Migratory Birds - The seasons for blue and snow geese are similar to those established for Canada geese with limits (5) unchanged from 1979. Coot, gallinule, rails, jacksnipe and woodcock also follow the 1979 framework.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09(2), 23.11(1), 29.085, 29.174 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends and creates rules interpreting sections 23.09(2), 29.085, and 29.174, Wisconsin Statutes, as follows:

Section 1. NR 10.01(1) introductory paragraph is amended to read:

(1) MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS AND-WATERFOWL.

Section 2. NR 10.01(1) (a) is amended to read:

Section 4. NR 10.01 (1)(1)1. is amended to read:

1. Canada goose permit and tag requirement. It is unlawful to hunt Canada geese without being in possession of a current Canada goose hunting permit, Canada goose tags and valid state hunting license. Permits and tags are valid only in the zone and time period of issue.

Section 5. NR 10.10(1)(1)2.b. 1) and 2) are amended to read:

- 1) October ~~16~~ - October 31
- 2) November ~~1~~ - ~~December-9~~ November 24

Section 6. NR 10.01(1)(1)5. is amended to read:

5. Permits issued. a. Horicon zone - ~~29,000~~ 25,000 b. East Central zone - ~~22,300~~ 30,300

Section 7. NR 10.12 (3)(d) 1. and 2 are amended to read:

1. 1500 feet from any shoreline, including islands, for the purpose of taking, catching, killing and shooting at migratory game birds during the season prescribed in section NR 10.01(b)1.

2. 500 feet from any shoreline, including islands, for the purpose of taking, catching, killing and shooting at scaup ducks during the season prescribed in section NR 10.01(1)(b)2(c).

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on August 21, 1980.

The rules contained herein shall take effect upon publication as provided in section 227.026(1) intro., Wisconsin Statutes.

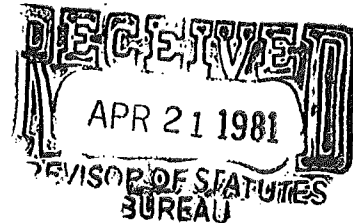




Dear Mr. Prestegard:
