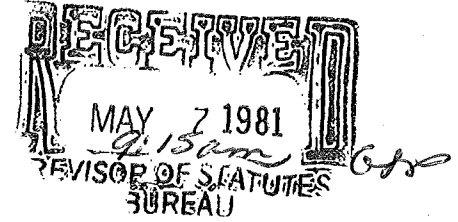

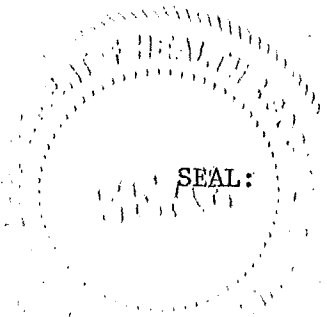
TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

I further certify that said copy has been compared by me with the original on file in this department and that the same is a true copy thereof, and of the whole of such original.

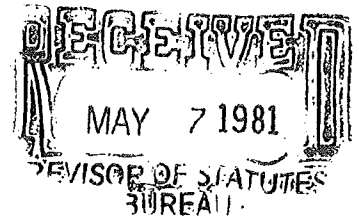

ORDER OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES
REPEALING RULES



Relating to rules concerning minimum standards for county homes, infirmaries, general hospitals, public medical institutions, and mental hospitals.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services:

Chapters PW 1 and PW 2 have been made obsolete due to statutory changes which have altered the functional operation of county homes, infirmaries, general hospitals, public medical institutions, and mental hospitals. The repeal of ss. 46.165, 51.25, and 51.26, Wis. Stats., and the enactment of ss. 46.175, 50.02, 50.03, and 50.36, Wis. Stats., resulted in the conversion of those facilities into general and special hospitals now governed by H 24 rules, nursing homes now governed by H 32 rules, and community based residential facilities now governed by HSS 3 rules.

The Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse offered no comments and made no recommendations on the proposed repeals.

A 30-day notice that the agency would repeal the rule chapters without public hearing unless petitioned for a hearing was published in the Wisconsin Administrative Register. No petition was received.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Health and Social Services by s. 227.014(2), Wis. Stats., the Department of Health and Social Services hereby repeals rules interpreting ss. 46.165, 51.25, and 51.26, Wis. Stats., as follows:

Chapter PW 1 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.
Chapter PW 2 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Rules repealed by this order are repealed effective the first day of the month following publication of notice of repeal in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in Section 227.026(1), Wis. Stats.

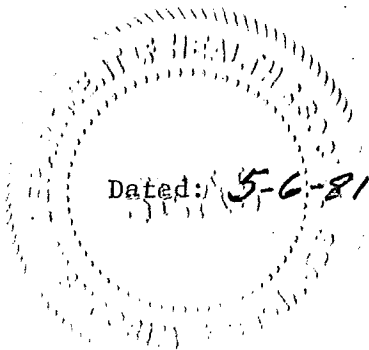

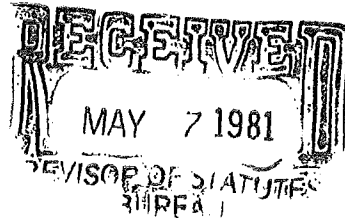
