ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The Department proposes to alter the 1981-82 hunting and trapping seasons by establishing new deer quotas and modifying the special beaver season. In addition, a special one-day buck season is added to the current experimental deer season on the Sandhill Wildlife Area and a new deer management unit map is created for housekeeping purposes.

- 1. Deer quotas proposed for the 1981 season total 57,860 deer which is a 17% increase over the 49,415 quota deer harvested in 1980. The increase is in response to an unusual rate of deer population growth following two consecutive mild winters.
- 2. For the past five years, thriving beaver populations have been responsible for producing significant damage to trout streams, lowland forests, roads and private property. Efforts to eliminate this difficulty have centered upon increased harvest by using special seasons. Frequently, shortcomings in trapping efforts cannot be detected until late into the regular season and little opportunity exists for extending the season. With the authority to establish the season by publication consistent with the authority for the early season, problem waters could be treated through April.
- 3. The Sandhill Wildlife Area is a 9,640 acre experimental area surrounded by a deer-proof fence. Hunting has been restricted to antlerless deer since 1979. Antler growth on many of the protected bucks has increased to a size which offers a chance for a trophy deer. A one-day season will minimize the risk of overharvesting bucks the initial year while providing the opportunity to take a trophy buck.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 29.02, 29.108, 29.174(2) and 227.014, Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends, repeals and recreates, and creates rules interpreting ss. 29.02, 29.108 and 29.174(2), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 3. NR 10.22(2)(b)3. (intro) is amended to read:


3. A firearm season will be permitted for anti-erless deer hunting. The hunting of all other animals shall-be is prohibited.

SECTION 4. NR 10.22(2)(b)3.e. is repealed and recreated to read:

e. The daily bag limit the first day of the season is one deer of either sex. Thereafter, the daily bag is one deer with antlers less than 3 inches in length. The season limit is one deer.

SECTION 5. NR 10.28(1) is repealed and recreated to read:

(1) Deer management units are established as designated on the following map:
