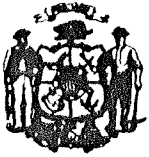

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RULES in FINAL DRAFT FORM

Rule: Section ILHR 81.10

Relating to: Length of Apprenticeship for Automatic Fire
Sprinkler System Apprentices.

Clearinghouse Rule No.: 83-108

Administrative rules to amend ss. ILHR 81.10 (1) (a), 81.10 (1) (d) 2. and 3. and 81.10 (1) (g) relating to the length of apprenticeship for an automatic fire sprinkler system apprentice.

ANALYSIS OF RULES

The Bureau of Plumbing within the Division of Safety and Building is responsible for developing and administering the present administrative rules concerning the registration and training of automatic fire sprinkler system apprentices. The proposed rules to shorten the length of apprenticeship from 5 years to 4 years comes at the request of Local 669 Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee and reflects the term of apprenticeship as agreed between the National Automatic Sprinkler Fire Control Association, Inc. and Road Sprinkler Fitters, Local Union No. 669.

The proposed rules have the endorsement of the automatic fire sprinkler system contractors and journeyman council. The members of the council are:

Eugene Rice, Business Agent of Local 669, United Association of Journeyman and Apprentices.

Dennis Driebel, Business Agent of Local 183, Sprinkler Fitters and Apprentices Union.

Jeff Bateman, President, Pioneer Fire Protection, Inc.

Ray Malek, Vice President, Sprinkler Division of Grunau Company.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by ss. 101.02 (1) and 145.17 (2), Stats., the department hereby amends rules interpreting ss. 145.16 and 145.17 (2), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. ILHR 81.10 (1) (a) is amended to read:

ILHR 81.10 (1) (a) General. The department may determine and prescribe the conditions under which any person may serve an automatic fire sprinkler system apprenticeship. Credit shall be granted for educational and training programs approved by the department. Every person, regardless of age, commencing an automatic fire sprinkler system apprenticeship after July 1, 1973, shall be indentured under ch. 106, Stats. The term of an automatic fire sprinkler system apprentice shall be 5 4 years, but the department may upon application of the apprentice or the apprentice's employer or both, extend ~~such the~~ term, but ~~such an~~ extension shall not exceed one year. After expiration of an apprenticeship term no apprentice ~~shall~~ may engage in the business of automatic fire sprinkler system work either as an apprentice or as journeyman automatic fire spinkler fitter unless after the expiration of the apprenticeship term the apprentice secures a journeyman automatic fire sprinkler fitter's license. In case of failure to pass the examination for ~~such the~~ license, the apprentice may continue to serve as an apprentice but not beyond the time for reexamination for a journeyman automatic fire sprinkler fitter's license, as prescribed ~~by the rules of the department~~ in sub. (4) (f).

SECTION 2. ILHR 81.10 (1) (d) 2. and 3. is amended to read:

ILHR 81.10 (1) (d) 2. During the first ~~2-1/2~~ 2 years of apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be given the opportunity to install ~~such~~ automatic fire sprinkler system material as the apprentice's skill ~~may permit~~ permits. The apprentice shall be under the immediate supervision of a journeyman automatic fire sprinkler fitter licensed in Wisconsin.

~~3. During the second half of the third year and the fourth and fifth years any~~ third and fourth years of apprenticeship an apprentice may, under general supervision of a licensed journeyman automatic fire sprinkler fitter, make ~~such only those~~ automatic fire sprinkler system installations as the apprentice's skill ~~will permit~~ permits.

SECTION 3. ILHR 81.10 (1) (g) is amended to read:

ILHR 81.10 (1) (g) Suspension. If an apprenticeship ceases to exist, if registration is accepted with incomplete or inaccurate information, or if willful noncompliance with the shop and school training requirements exists, the department shall suspend ~~such a~~ registration until the deficiencies are remedied. The department may cancel registration ~~if necessary~~. A registration which has lapsed either through suspension or cancellation may be renewed in the same manner as new registrations. The department may grant ~~such~~ credit toward completion of the ~~5-year~~ 4-year apprenticeship ~~as it may deem proper~~.

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Pursuant to s. 227.026 (1) (intro.), Stats., these rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register.

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
