## ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AMENDING RULES

- To amend PI 3.23(3)(a) and (b) and (4)(a) and (b) relating to school
- 2 counselors, school psychologists, and school social workers eligibility to
- 3 obtain school administrator certification.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Public Instruction

Presently, three years of classroom teaching experience are required for licensure as an elementary or secondary level school administrator. School counselors, school psychologists, and school social workers work closely with children in a school setting. The proposed amendments to the requirements for obtaining licenses as an elementary or secondary level administrator would allow persons with three years of successful experience as a school counselor, school psychologist, or a school social worker to count their experience in these roles toward the classroom experience requirement provided that these persons had also completed at least 540 hours of successful classroom teaching experience.

- 6 amends rules interpreting s. 118.24, Stats., as follows:

- 10 school counselor, a school psychologist, or a school social worker and 18 semester
- ll credits in professional education course work not included as a part of an
- 12 approved school administrator program; or completion of an approved elementary
- 13 level teacher education program, elementary level or kindergarten through
- 14 grade 12 school counselor program, school psychologist program, or school
- 15 social work program and 18 semester credits in professional education course
- 16 work not included as a part of an approved school administrator program.

Three years of successful elassroom-teaching experience as a classroom teacher at the elementary school, middle school, 2 or junior high school level or three years of successful experience as a 3 4 school counselor, school psychologist, or school social worker at the elementary school, middle school, or junior high school level which included 5 evidence of not less than 540 hours of successful classroom teaching experience. 6 7 PI 3.23(4)(a). Eligibility to hold a Wisconsin license to teach 8 in the secondary schools or to serve as a secondary or kindergarten through 9 grade 12 school counselor, a school psychologist, or a school social worker 10 and 18 semester credits in professional education course work not included 11 as a part of an approved school administrator program; or completion of an 12 approved secondary level teacher education program, a secondary level or kindergarten through grade 12 school counselor program, a school psychologist 13 14 program, or a school social work program and 18 semester credits in profes-15 sional education course work not included as a part of an approved school 16 administrator program. 17 PI 3.23(4)(b). Three years of successful elassroom-teaching 18 experience as a classroom teacher at the middle school, junior high school, 19 or senior high school level or three years of successful experience as a school counselor, school psychologist, or school social worker at the middle 20 21 school, junior high school, or senior high school level which included evidence 22 of not less than 540 hours of successful classroom teaching experience.

The rule contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.
