

**ORDER OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION  
AMENDING RULES**

Renumber s. Trans 110.14(1); renumber and amend s. Trans 108.10(1)(d); and to create s. Trans 108.10(1)(e) and 110.14(1)(b), Wis. Admin. Code, relating to driver licensing and school bus licensing.

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**ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE  
WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION**

This rule proposal creates Section 108.10(1)(e) and Section 110.14(1)(b), Wis. Admin. Code. Those sections permit review boards to provide the Department of Transportation with recommendations based on an individual driver's medical history. These review board recommendations may include recommended exceptions to other provisions of Chapter Trans 108 and 110, Wis. Admin. Code. The standards for initial licensing decisions by the Department remain the same.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

No fiscal impact is anticipated from the promulgation of these rule changes.

**REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ANALYSIS**

This amendment has no significant impact on small businesses.  
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Pursuant to the authority vested in the Department of Transportation by ss. 85.16(1) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats., the Department of Transportation hereby amends rules interpreting certain provisions of ss. 343.09, 343.12, 343.13 and 343.16, Stats., as follows:

**RULE TEXT**

SECTION 1. Trans 108.10(1)(d) is renumbered Trans 108.10(1)(e) and amended to read:

Trans 108.10(1)(e) Except as provided in (d), Appearances  
appearances before a medical review board are not afforded for  
the sole purpose of reviewing the nature or extent of  
restrictions imposed on licenses held under this chapter.

SECTION 2. Trans 108.10(1)(d) is created to read:

Trans 108.10(1)(d) When the application of s. Trans  
108.07(1) or (3) is at issue, the medical review board may assess  
the person's medical history and may recommend that an exception  
to s. Trans 108.07(1) or (3) be granted by the department if, in  
the medical review board's medical opinion, the person's medical  
condition does not impair the person's ability to safely operate  
a motor vehicle under unrestricted conditions of a chauffeur's  
license and a school bus license.


SECTION 3. Trans 110.14(1) is renumbered Trans  
110.14(1)(a).

SECTION 4. Trans 110.14(1)(b) is created to read:

Trans 110.14(1)(b) When the application of s. Trans 110.07,  
110.08, 110.09, 110.10, 110.11 or 110.13 is at issue, the medical  
review board may assess the person's medical history and may  
recommend that an exception to these sections be granted by the  
department if, in the medical review board's opinion, the  
person's medical condition does not impair the person's ability  
to operate a school bus.

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The rules contained in this order shall take effect upon the  
first day of the month following publication as provided in s.  
227.22(2) (intro.), Stats.
