IN THE MATTER OF an Order Adopting Rule AMENDING Trans 328.03(intro.) and CREATING Trans 328.03(5), Wisconsin Administrative Code, relating to motor carrier safety requirements for intrastate transportation of hazardous materials.

ORDER ADOPTING RULE

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: ss. 227.11 and 346.45(4), Stats.

STATUTES INTERPRETED: ss. 110.07, 110.075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats.

General Summary of Rule. Chapter Trans 328 adopted motor carrier safety requirements for intrastate transportation of hazardous materials of the United States Department of Transportation in effect on November 1, 1991. This amendment changes the date from November 1, 1991 to November 1, 1993. This change allows Wisconsin to enforce the most recent version of the motor carrier safety requirements for intrastate transportation of hazardous materials. All vehicles operating in interstate commerce are already subject under federal law to any changes that have been adopted between November 1, 1991 and November 1, 1993.

<u>Fiscal Effect</u>. This rule amendment will not have a fiscal effect upon the state, any local governments or the private sector.

<u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. This rule amendment will not have any significant adverse effect on small businesses.

TEXT OF RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation, by ss. 227.11 and 346.45(4), Stats., the department of transportation hereby amends a rule interpreting ss. 110.07, 110.075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats., relating to motor carrier safety requirements for intrastate transportation of hazardous materials.

SECTION 1. Trans 328.03(intro.) is amended to read:

TRANS 328.03 FEDERAL REGULATION ADOPTED. The following federal motor carrier safety regulations adopted by the United States department of transportation and in effect on November 1, 1991 1993, are adopted by the department and shall be enforced in relation to those carriers, drivers or vehicles which operate in intrastate commerce in the same manner as though the regulations were set out in full in this section chapter:

SECTION 2. Trans 328.03(5) is created to read:

Trans 328.03(5) Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, part 180, continuing qualification and maintenance of packagings.


