

PROPOSED ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, TRADE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

- 1 The state of Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and
- 2 consumer protection proposes the following order to repeal ATCP
- 3 30.35(2)(b) and (c) and portions of chapter ATCP 30 Appendix A,
- 4 to renumber and amend ATCP 30.35(2)(a), and to create portions of
- 5 chapter ATCP 30 Appendix A relating to atrazine use restrictions.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

Statutory authority: ss. 93.07(1), 94.69(9), 160.19(2), and 160.21(1), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 94.69, 160.19(2) and 160.21(1), Stats.

In order to protect Wisconsin groundwater, current rules under ch. ATCP 30, Wis. Adm. Code, restrict the statewide rate at which atrazine pesticides may be applied. Current rules also prohibit the use of atrazine in areas where groundwater contamination levels attain or exceed state enforcement standards.

Based on new groundwater test data, this rule expands the number of areas in which atrazine use is prohibited. This rule also amends current rules regulating land spreading of soils and water containing atrazine.

Atrazine Prohibition Areas

Current rules prohibit the use of atrazine where atrazine contamination of groundwater equals or exceeds the current groundwater enforcement standard under ch. NR 140, Wis. Adm. Code. Current rules prohibit atrazine use in 71 designated areas, including major prohibition areas in the lower Wisconsin river valley and much of Dane and Columbia counties.

This rule repeals and recreates 4 current prohibition areas to expand those areas, and creates 9 new prohibition areas, resulting in a new total of 80 prohibition areas throughout the state. The rule includes maps describing each of the new and expanded prohibition areas.

Within every prohibition area, atrazine applications are prohibited. Atrazine mixing and loading operations are also prohibited unless conducted over a spill containment surface which complies with ss. ATCP 29.151(2) to (4), Wis. Adm. Code.

Land Spreading Soils and Water

Under current rules, the department may issue a permit authorizing any person to land spread soil and water containing atrazine residues in order to remedy soil contamination. The amount of atrazine and atrazine metabolites applied to a site by land spreading may not exceed the maximum application rates for atrazine active ingredient permitted under s. ATCP 30.10, Wis. Adm. Code.

This rule modifies current landspreading authorization procedures to conform to procedures under the agricultural chemical cleanup program created under s. 94.73, Stats. This rule eliminates current permit and permit application requirements, but retains the requirement of written authorization. This rule does not change the amount of atrazine and atrazine metabolites that may be applied to a site by landspreading.

- SECTION 1. ATCP 30.35(2)(a) is renumbered ATCP 30.35(2) and amended to read:
- 3 ATCP 30.35(2) LAND SPREADING SOILS AND WATER.
- 4 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, the department may
- 5 issue a written permit authorizing authorize any person to land
- 6 spread soils or water containing residues of atrazine or its
- 7 metabolites in order to remedy soil or water contamination.
- 8 Authorization, if any, shall be given in writing. The amount of
- 9 atrazine and atrazine metabolites applied to a site by means of
- 10 land spreading may not exceed the amount of atrazine active
- ingredient permitted under s. ATCP 30.10.
- 12 **SECTION 2.** ATCP 30.35(2)(b) and (c) are repealed.
