



**ORDER ADOPTING RULE**



**Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation**

**STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** s. 227.11, Stats.

**STATUTES INTERPRETED:** ss. 194.38 and 194.43, Stats.

**General Summary of Rule.** Chapter MVD 6 was enacted several years ago to regulate the transportation of explosives. The rule was based on Federal Hazardous Material Transportation regulations. In 1985, Wisconsin adopted the Federal Hazardous Material Regulations under ch. Trans 326 for interstate operation and, in 1991, ch. Trans 328 for intrastate carriers. Both of those rules have provisions that specifically cover the transportation of explosives and are current and uniform with federal as well as other state regulations. This rule making will repeal MVD 6 and will eliminate duplication of other rules.

**Fiscal Impact.** The Department estimates that there will be no fiscal impact on the liabilities or revenues of any county, city, village, town, school district, technical college district and sewerage district.

**Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis.** This proposed rule will have no adverse effect on small businesses.

**TEXT OF RULE**




**SECTION 1.** Chapter MVD 6 is repealed.


**(END OF RULE TEXT)**


