ORDER

An order of the Hearing and Speech Examining Board to create HAS 6.02 (4m) and 6.09 (2) (w) relating to the performance of cerumen management by audiologists.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b) and 227.11 (2), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 459.20 (2) and 459.34 (2) (b), Stats.

In this proposed rule-making order, the Hearing and Speech Examining Board creates s. HAS 6.02 (4m) to define the term "cerumen management" to mean the removal of cerumen (commonly referred to as "earwax") from the external auditory canal by the utilization of methods and techniques performed in accordance with minimum standards and procedures established in the health care professions. Cerumen primarily functions to lubricate, clean and protect the ear canal by providing a chemical barrier to bacterial and fungal infection and by providing an obstruction to the entrance of foreign bodies into the canal. Removal of excess deposits of cerumen is a prerequisite to administering a number of diagnostic audiological procedures and treatments.

Section HAS 6.09 (2) (w) is created to reflect that the board considers it unprofessional conduct for an audiologist to fail to perform cerumen management in a competent manner.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. HAS 6.02 (4m) is created to read:

HAS 6.02 (4m) "Cerumen management" means the removal of cerumen from the external auditory canal by the utilization of methods and techniques performed in accordance with minimum standards and procedures established in the audiological profession.

SECTION 2. HAS 6.09 (2) (w) is created to read:

HAS 6.09 (2) (w) Failing to perform cerumen management in a competent manner.
