Prairie Village to be called Prairieville.

SEC. 4: That the name of [the] town of Prairie Village, comprising township numbered six of range numbered nineteen in the county of Milwaukee is hereby changed to Prairieville, and by that name shall hereafter be known and called: to have the same powers and privileges it now has.

SEC. 5. This act to take effect from and after the first day of March next.

No. 3.

AN ACT to establish a Territorial road from Madison to Frankfort in Dodge county.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Wisconsin, That Hamilton Stevens, Charles M. Rogers, and Eber Peck be authorized to lay out and establish a Territorial road, commencing at Madison, the seat of government of the Territory, and extending thence, by the nearest and most direct route, to Frankfort, in the county of Dodge.

· Sec. 2. That said Commissioners be required to lay out and establish said road agreeably to the provisions of an act entitled "an act to provide for laying and opening Territorial roads," approved, January 3, 1838.

SEC. 3. That Section five of an act entitled "an act to provide for laying out and establishing Territorial roads therein named," approved Dec. 13, 1838, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. The said Commissioners shall proceed to lay out and establish said road in the manner above prescribed within three months from the passage of this act, and not thereafter.
