

estate within the incorporated limits of the city, not exceeding one per cent., on the assessed value of such property: *Provided*, however, that if in any year the exigency of the case shall require it, such tax may be increased to any rate not exceeding two per cent. on such assessed value.

Tax payer to receive receipt.

SEC. 3. Every person who shall pay such tax shall be entitled to receive from the treasurer of said city a receipt therefor, specifying the sum paid and for what object, and such receipt or receipts shall, upon their surrender to the proper officer of said city, entitle the holder or assignee thereof to a transfer and assignment from said city of a share or shares of such capital stock subscribed as aforesaid, equal in amount to the amount of such receipts: *Provided*, however, that in estimating the value of such shares, in case the instalments on the same shall have been paid for with the proceeds of any loan herein authorized, interest on such instalments shall be included.

Chap 93. An act to authorize the apportionment of school monies to district No. 10, in the towns of Lima and Johnstown, in Rock county.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The commissioner of common schools or town superintendent of the towns of Lima and Johnstown are hereby authorized to apportion to joint school district number ten, in the said towns of Lima and Johnstown, their proportioned share of the school monies now in the treasuries of said town.

Chap 94. An act to vacate part of the plat of the village of Mequanigo, in the county of Waukesha.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Blocks numbered one, two, and ten, and Pleasant street, in the village of Mequanigo, in the county of Waukesha,

and also all the streets surrounding blocks numbered one and ten are hereby vacated.

An act to authorize school district number two, in the town of Mequanigo to renew a tax warrant. Chap 95.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That the trustees of school district number two, in the town of Mukwonago, Waukesha county, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to re-issue to the collector of said district the tax warrant heretofore issued by them for the purpose of collecting a tax of one hundred and fifty-seven dollars and forty-nine cents to build a school house in said district, and to renew the same from time to time as specified in the second section of this act, and the said collector is hereby authorized and empowered to collect under such warrant, when so renewed and reissued, all sums of money specified in the said tax list which are unpaid, in the same manner he might have done under the original warrant. Authorized to issue tax warrant.

SEC. 2. That the trustees of said district number two, in the town of Mukwonago, may renew such warrant from time to time until said tax be collected: *Provided*, that the renewals authorized by this act shall not be for a longer time in the aggregate than one year. May renew warrant.

An act to incorporate the Spring Valley Academical Association. Chap 96.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That Henry C. Wheeler, Enoch D. Woodhridge, Simeon W. Abbott, James Kirkpatrick, Lyman Kingman, and John Howe, and their associates, together with such persons as may hereafter be associated with them, be and are hereby created a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, by the name and title of the "Spring Valley Academical Association," by which name they and their successors shall be forever known and have perpetual succession, and shall have power to contract and be con- Trustees, &c.
