Chap. 20. An Act to amend an act to authorise George Lerwick to build and maintain a dam across the Oconto river, approved February 16, 1842.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. That David Jones and John W. Arndt, their successors and assigns, are hereby invested with all the rights and privileges granted to George Lerwick and his associates in said act.

Chap. 21. An Act to vacate a certain portion of Greenhazen's addition to the village of Cedarburg.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

First vacated.

SECTION 1. That that portion of Greenhazen's addition to the village of Cedarburg, situated on the south-east quarter of the north-east quarter of section number twenty-seven in township ten (10,) north of range twenty-one (21,) east, in the county of Washington, which lies on the west side of Cedar Creek, and Blocks one, two, seven and eight (1, 2, 7, and 8,) on the east side of said creek; be and the same is hereby vacated.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
