An Act to incorporate the Calumet Village and Sheb ygan Plank Road Company.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. That Augustus Huyssen, Edmond Delany, George White, Michael Rothman, Querin Lohn, Lewis Rollman, and James Cramond he, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, under the direction of a majority of whom subscriptions may be received to the capital stock of the Calumet Village and Sheboygan Plank Road Company, hereby incorporated, and they may cause books to be opened at such times and places as they shall direct, for the purpose of receiving subscriptions to the capital stock of said company, first giving thirty days' notice of
