

Chap 338 An Act to provide for the maintenance of the County Poor of Waukesha County.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That from and after the passage of this act the board of supervisors of Waukesha county be and they are hereby authorized to make such disposition in regard to the support or maintenance of paupers, by the laws of this [state] chargeable to said county, as they may deem most advisable, and it shall be the duty of said board to make all proper provision for the care and support of such paupers.

SEC. 2. The board of supervisors of said county may at any annual meeting or special meeting called for that purpose, levy and cause to be collected on the taxable real and personal property of such county, a tax not exceeding two mills on the dollar in any one year, for the purpose of purchasing or hiring a suitable farm and dwelling, and the necessary stock and implements for the management of the same, or any other expense the said board may deem necessary for the proper disposition, regulation, and support of all county paupers now chargeable or that may hereafter be by law chargeable to said county of Waukesha.
