An Act to authorize Joseph F. Kirkland and his associates to build and maintain a Toll Bridge across the Sheboygan River, in the County of Sheboygan. **Chap 409**

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That Joseph F. Kirkland, his associates and assigns, shall have power to build and maintain a float bridge across the Sheboygan river in the county of She- May build bridge. boygan, at any point opposite block number three hundred and thirteen, (113.) in the village of Sheboygan.

SEC. 2. Said bridge shall not be less than sixteen feet in width, and shall contain a draw over the channel of How built. said river not less than thirty feet wide, which shall be opened at all times for the passage of boats, rafts, or other craft free of charge, without unnecessary interruption or delay.

SEC. 3. The said Joseph F. Kirkland, his associates Rates of toll. and assigns, shall have power immediately after the completion of said bridge, to demand and collect tolls for passing over said bridge as follows: for any vehicle drawn by two horses, mules, or oxen, ten cents, and for each additional horse or ox, two cents; for any vehicle drawn by one horse, six cents; for a single horse, five cents; for horses and cattle in droves, three cents each; for hogs and sheep in droves, two cents each; for foot passengers two cents each.

SEC. 4. Said Kirkland, his associates and assigns shall keep posted up in a conspicuous place on said bridge the To post up rates of toll. rates of toll allowed by this act.

SEC. 5. Any person or persons committing any malicious injury to said bridge, shall be liable to the said Kirkland, his associates and assigns, to the amount of injury done, and all damages sustained may be collected before Penalty for injury to bridge. any court having competent jurisdiction thereof, and upon

conviction thereof shall be punished in the manner prescribed by law for offences of that nature.

When completed.

SEC. 6. Said bridge shall be completed within one year from the passage of this act.

SEC. 7. Any future legislature may alter, amend, or repeal this act.

Penalty for evading toll.

SEC. 8. Any person or persons who shall forcibly or fraudulently pass over the said bridge without paying the legal toll, shall for each offence, forfeit the sum of two dollars to and for the use of said Joseph F. Kirkland, his associates and assigns, to be recovered in an action of trespass or trespass on the case before any court having competent jurisdiction.

Trustees may make bridge free

SEC. 9. The board of trustees of the village of Sheboygan shall have power and authority to make and declare said bridge free, on first paying to the said Kirkland, his associates or assigns, the cost of the construction of the said bridge, and of the necessary fixtures thereof, and if the said Kirkland, his associates or assigns shall fail to build and complete said bridge within six months from the date of this act, then and in such case the board of trustees shall have authority to build and maintain a free bridge across the said river, whenever in their opinion the interests of the said village shall be best promoted thereby.

SEC. 10. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

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Chap 410

An Act concerning Town Treasurers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Treasurer to make statement

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the town treasurer of each town in the several counties of this state, to make out in writing a statement of the amount of money by him received in his said capacity of treasurer, and which he has or ought to pay over to the treasurer of his county; in which statement he shall set forth particularly, the person, officer, or officers, respectively, from whom he has received
