

An Act to pay John Taylor the sum of money therein named.

Chap 475

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to John Taylor, late warden of the state prison, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of two thousand and eight hundred and twelve dollars to be paid by him to the several persons holding unsettled accounts against the state prison, dated subsequent to the 26th day of December, A. D. 1851, the same being contracts made by said John Taylor as warden of the state prison, and to present vouchers for all moneys paid by him, and settle the same with the state treasurer.

Money appropriated.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the state treasurer, before paying out any money under the provisions of this act, to take from the said John Taylor a bond with two or more sufficient securities, to be approved by said treasurer in the penal sum of five thousand dollars, conditioned that he will pay out and apply the money hereby appropriated and return the balance, if any shall remain, and vouchers for such as shall be paid out to the said treasurer agreeably to the provisions of this act.

To give bond.

SEC. 3. The further sum of three hundred and sixty-five dollars is hereby appropriated to said John Taylor, warden as aforesaid, to be by him applied to the payment for provisions, &c., contracted for by him, for the sustenance of the state prisoners, and delivered at said prison since the first day of January aforesaid; which amount shall be by him paid out for that purpose, and he shall take vouchers therefor, and shall settle the same with the state treasurer, and shall pay any balance that may remain in his hands, into the state treasury, within one month after he shall receive the amount last above specified.

Further appropriation.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
