

Chap. 2. Joint Resolutions in relation to the improvement of the Sault de St. Marie River.

Resolved by the Senate (the Assembly concurring.) That in the opinion of the legislature of Wisconsin the immediate improvement of the Sault de St. Marie river so as to make Lake Superior accessible to all vessels navigating the other great lakes, is required by the best interests of the north-west and the whole Union, and that congress should without delay appropriate the means to make such improvement.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to send copies of this resolution to our senators and representatives in congress to be laid by them before congress.

Chap. 3. Joint Resolution relative to the Public Works on the Fox and Wisconsin Rivers.

Resolved by the Senate and Assembly of the State of Wisconsin, That the commissioners of the Board of Public Works of the Fox and Wisconsin rivers are authorized and instructed to adopt the south channel of the outlet of lake Winnebago and the works thereon constructed as a part of the public works of improvement: *Provided,* The same shall be done free of charge or cost to the state or the improvement fund: *And provided also,* That the owners or their representatives of said work shall give satisfactory security that they will erect a guard lock of the same width as the main lock, and dredge out the channel below said lock by aid of the steam dredge, which shall be furnished by said commissioners free of charge, and who shall be authorized to stipulate the length of time necessary to do said dredging after the dredge shall arrive there.
