such overseer, shall be credited on his tax one dollar for every day he shall actually work eight hours on such highway, and fifty cents a day for every wagon, or plow, and seventy-five cents for each yoke of oxen, and one dollar twenty-five cents for each span of horses he shall furnish agreeably to the requirements of said overseer.

§ 2. So much of section thirty-three of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes as conflicts with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed.

Chap. 45.

AN ACT to regulate the weight and measure of Flass Seed, Timothy Seed, and Potatoes.

Published, March 31, 1854.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

§ 1. Whenever flax seed, timothy seed, or potatoes shall be sold by the bushel, and no special agreement as to the measure or weight thereof shall be made by the parties, the measure thereof shall be ascertained by weight, and shall be computed as follows:

Fifty-six pounds for a bushel of flax seed; forty-six pounds for a bushel of timothy seed; and sixty pounds for a bushel of potatoes.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
