JOINT RESOLUTION in relation to the State Prison.

Resolved, by the Senate, (the Assembly concurring,) That the south wing of the state prison to be built at Waupun, be and the same is hereby required to be built of the length of two hundred feet, so as to contain at least two hundred and eighty cells, but in other respects as contemplated by the resolution of the senate and assembly, approved April 2d, 1853; this resolution, however, is in no wise to affect or to be construed as adopting or approving of any contract or contracts that may have been entered into by the late state prison commissioner with any person or persons, until such contracts shall have been approved by the governor, as required by law.

JOINT RESOLUTION relative to the State Prison grounds at Waupun.

Resolved, by the Senate, (the Assembly concurring,) That the commissioner of the state prison at Waupun is authorized and instructed to proceed immediately to the building of a suitable fence around the prison grounds, without the formality of advertizing, as is now directed by law.
