Joint Resolution in relation to the Transmission of the Statutes and Public Acts of Wisconsin to "The New York Law Institute."

Resolved, by the Senate and Assembly of the State of Wisconsin, That the secretary of state be directed to transmit to "The New York Law Institute," in the city of New York, a full and complete set of the statutes and public acts of the State of Wisconsin, heretofore published; and also of those hereafter to be passed, at each session of the legislature, as soon as published and ready for delivery, and distribution.

Joint Resolution instructing the committee on enrolled bills to strike out certain words in an act entitled "an act to amend the charter of the Milwaukee and Mississippi Railroad Company."

Resolved, by the Senate the Assembly concurring, That the joint committee on enrolled bills are hereby instructed to strike out the words "or near" where they first occur in section one of a bill, entitled "a bill to amend the charter of the Milwaukee and Mississippi Railroad company," which has passed the senate and assembly and been enrolled, and which words were stricken out by the senate in its passage, and was transmitted to the Assembly with those words in the engrossed bill.

Joint Resolution relative to the sale of School and University Lands.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be, and he is hereby directed to cause to be published the "suspending the sale of the School and University lands, except for settlement and cultivation," immediately after the same shall be approved by the Governor.
