An Act concerning Notaries Public, and other officers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Concerning
notaries public

SECTION 1. The clerks of the circuit court of this state are hereby authorized to certify, in the same manner as they are now authorized to do in the case of justices of the peace, to the official qualifications of any notary public residing in their county, who shall have deposited in their office a certificate of the secretary of state, showing that such notary public is duly qualified, and the time when his commission will expire ; together with his autograph and an impression of his official seal.

Record by
clerk of circuit
court.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the several clerks of the circuit court to keep a record of all certificates so deposited with him as aforesaid.

Resignations,
&c.

SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary of state, when any notary public shall resign or be removed to [from] his office, to notify forthwith the clerk of the circuit court of the proper county of such resignation or removal.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
