

ed shall qualify and resume the duties of their respective offices, the said county of Juneau shall remain under the jurisdiction of said Adams county, for all county purposes, and the business to be transacted with county officers, and all county officers so elected at such special elections shall enter upon the duties of the office to which they are severally elected, as soon as they shall legally qualify under such election.

Terms of court

SEC. 4. There is hereby established in the county of Juneau, two terms each year of said circuit court, which shall be held by the judge of the seventh judicial circuit, at such time as he shall appoint, until said terms are regularly established by law. The said judge shall further appoint the times for holding such terms of court, and give notice of the same by filing a notice of the same with the clerk of the circuit court of said county.

To transcribe

SEC. 5. The register of deeds of Adams county shall, as soon as may be, transcribe into suitable books, all records of conveyance and other papers recorded in his office; at the time this act shall go into operation, relating to real estate, situated in the territory hereby embraced in said county of Juneau, and deliver the same to the register of deeds, who shall be elected in said county of Juneau, and shall receive therefor the compensation now established by law for like services.

County seat.

SEC. 6. The county seat of said county of Juneau shall be and hereby is located at the village of New Lisbon, in town sixteen, range three, east of the fourth principal meridian.

SEC. 7. This act shall be in force and go into effect on the first day of January, A. D. 1857.

## CHAPTER 131.

*Published October 17.*

An Act to provide for levying a State Tax for the year 1856.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

State tax.

SECTION 1. There shall be levied and collected for the year 1856, a state tax of three hundred thousand dollars,

(300,000) to be apportioned among, and assessed upon the several counties of this state, as provided in chapter seventy-three (73), of the session laws of 1854, entitled "an act to establish a board of equalization of state tax, and to provide for levying a state tax for the year 1854," approved April 1st 1854: and shall be levied upon the property real and personal in this state, according to the equalization to be made the present year, by state board of equalization, which tax shall be levied, collected and paid into the state treasury as provided by law.

SEC. 2. The state board of equalization shall within ten days after the passage of this act proceed to, and make the equalization aforesaid, and immediately certify the same to the several counties in this state, as provided by law, to have full force and effect for the year 1856. Equalization.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect immediately after its passage, and shall be immediately printed, and ten printed copies thereof sent to the clerk of the board of supervisors of every county in this state—by the secretary of state.

## CHAPTER 132.

*Published November 14.*

An Act to prevent the spreading of a weed, known by the name of, Snapdragon.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person or persons residing upon or occupying any land within this state, either as owner, lessee or otherwise for purposes of cultivation, shall knowingly permit or allow the weed known by the name of Snapdragon, to go to seed on such land, under the pains and penalties prescribed in the following section: To prevent the growth of snapdragon.

SEC. 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of the preceding section, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars nor less than five dollars. Punishment for not complying with this act.
